Notes From the Superintendent

The 3rd quarter grading period ended on Friday, March 15th, and report cards were issued on Friday, March 22, 2024. After reviewing the report card with your student, please contact your student's teacher if you have any questions or concerns. The Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR) computer-based testing for grades 3, 4, 5,6, 7, and 8 was administered April 9-19, 2024. Thank you to all our parents for your patience and support as we conduct these very important assessments.

At their regular March meeting, the Board of Education approved the District Calendar for the 2024-25 school year. The first day of student attendance will be Tuesday, August 13, 2024, which will be a 2:05 P.M. dismissal. We will have the entire week of Thanksgiving off next school year. The last day before Christmas break will be Friday, December 20, 2024, and school will resume Monday, January 6, 2025. Note that we will conduct E-Learning days in the event of a snow day so please be prepared to support your child on these days. Spring Break will be March 17-21 and students will have a short Easter Break April 18-21. The last day of student attendance will be Friday, May 23, 2025.

We hope you will have a chance to attend some of the district's other spring activities, junior high and high school track meets, baseball and softball games, music contests and concerts, and high school commencement.


