First and Second Grade Explorers

We had a great time this week commemorating Earth Day! We worked in our garden, planted herbs, and constructed bird houses from recycled milk cartons.

Students have been taking excellent care of their mealworms and tomato starts. We thinned and transplanted our tomatoes into larger containers and are beginning to see our mealworms metamorphose!

Students should now know what living (biotic) things and what nonliving (abiotic) things are. They should know what the traits and needs of living things are as well as how to classify vertebrates and invertebrates. They should know the definitions of environment and habitat. Students should also know how living things interact within their environment.

First grade students are expanding their knowledge of 3-D shapes with a study on 2-D shapes. Second graders are organizing and analyzing data in their latest math chapter.

Students must know basic sentence and paragraph structure at this point in the year and should be reading fluently. **Please reinforce these skills at home by encouraging students to keep a writing journal and have them READ aloud for 20-30 minutes every day.** First graders should be

reading 60-116 words per minute. Second graders should be reading 100-124 words per minute.

We had a great time out in the sunshine celebrating Earth Day!
