

# FIND HELP LOCALLY

#### 2-1-1 links the caller to:

- · Basic Human Needs: food, clothing, shelter, and other basic needs
- Physical & Mental Health: health insurance programs, Medicaid and Medicare, intervention services, support groups, counseling, drug and alcohol intervention, victim services, and rehabilitation
- Employment Support: Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), financial assistance, job training, transportation assistance, education programs, and foreclosure prevention services
- · Support for Senior Citizens: adult day care, respite care, home health care, transportation, specialized services for individuals of all ages with disabilities, employment assistance
- · Support for Children, Youth, & Families: child care, after-school programs, family resource centers, mentoring, tutoring, and protective services
- Distaster Relief and Recovery: emergency shelters, food distribution, clean up crews/debris removal, tarping, long term recovery, potable water, ice, grief counseling, State and Federal assistance

## CHILDREN OR UNACCOMPANIED YOUTHS THAT LIVE IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

 In a shelter In a motel or campground or bus or train station due to the lack of an alternative adequate

accommodation

- · In a car, park, abandoned building, Doubled up with other people
- due to loss of housing or economic hardship

## may gualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

## Eligible children and youth have the right to:

- · Receive a free, appropriate public education.
- · Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
- · Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
- · Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference and is feasible. • Transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this.
- · Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other
- students, according to the needs of the child or youth. If you believe a child or youth may be

eligible, contact the ALSDE Homeless Education Coordinator at 334-694-4529 or vour district's Homeless Liaison to find out what services and supports may be available.



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
