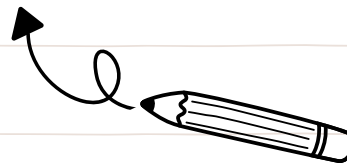
- Hold parent/ teacher conferences to share information about their child's social emotional and academic growth.

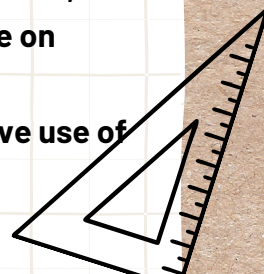
STUDENTS
