Statistics

- Approximately 268,000 highway-rail and pedestrian crossings/year in U.S.
- Most highway traffic fatalities occur within 25 miles of home
- In U.S., a train collides with a vehicle or a person once every 100 minutes
- More people die in highway-rail crossings than in commercial airline crashes

Remember

Always expect a train
Judging speed and distance is difficult
Never try to beat a train
Obey crossing signals
Watch for multiple sets of tracks

What Not to Do at Crossing

- Never stop on tracks
- Never stop within 15 feet of tracks
- Never try to back up once you're on tracks
- Never change gears on tracks
- Never pass on tracks

Summary

You can't be too careful
Do not short-cut the procedures
Use the quiet signal
Be familiar with local laws/procedures
