Parent/Guardian Authorization for Acetaminophen and Ibuprofen Administration

(For Students in Grades 6-8 Only)

The Sterling Community School Health Office Policy allows the school nurse to administer acetaminophen or ibuprofen to students in grades 6-8 for mild pain/discomfort, headache, menstrual cramps or following dental work under the "Standing Orders" signed by our medical advisor, Dr. Marc Cerrone and with the signed authorization by the student's parent or guardian. Students in grades preschool through 5 will need an "authorization to administer medication" form signed by both the physician and the parent or guardian.
