



March

This month, we will be studying BRUSHES. There are many different types of brushes that are used in various ways and made of different materials.

Children will build problem solving skills to determine which brush they might use to sweep the floor, brush their hair and/or for cleaning. Children will increase their vocabulary by learning new words related to the theme of brushes: Bristles, sweep, broom, toothbrush, clean, hairbrush, care, and groom.

STEAM: Children will engage in the exploration of wind. Wind can be useful to us as humans. A nice gentle breeze can help dry our clothes while they are hanging on the clothesline and keeps us cool when it is hot. Wind is helpful when flying a kite. Children will have the opportunity to play with Ribbon Sticks when we have a breeze outside. Another activity we have planned is to explore homemade parachutes.

Shcha mu (wild celery) season is coming soon. As a cultural experience, take the family for a drive, get out and walk to look for shcha mu. If you find some, wash thoroughly and have your child try the shcha mu by itself or by adding it to your food. If you go out shcha mu picking take pictures so we may share with the class.

What We Learned

February

Hello families, we hope your month has been as productive as ours. First, your children have been given more responsibility in their classroom jobs. We have added toothbrush helper, snack helper, and clean up monitor. As we explored boxes, your children were introduced to 3-dimensional shapes (spheres, cubes, cylinders, and prisms). Also, with your help and donation of cereal boxes, they were able to go on a letter hunt to find which boxes have some letters in their name.

With some children absent due to illness, we focused on handwashing and covering their sneezes/coughs. We found a video on YouTube titled, "Germ Smart Kids: How-To Handwashing" (link is https://www.youtube.com/watch? v=eNmte6Xe3R4). The video shows how to wash all parts of your hands. We hope to cut down on sharing germs with one another using this tool.

Our Laguna Language/Culture Class has been going well. The children are learning the words for the colors by listening to "Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What do you see?" Ms. Angela also created the color circles for display on the wall for us to go over during our Large Group Morning Meeting. We also use a color hunt as an activity to transition between the large group to children's choice time.

Finally, as we get ready for the month of March, Paguate classroom will participate in our annual Dr. Seuss week. The children were read to and shown six different Dr. Seuss stories, three on Wednesday and three on Thursday. After voting on which story they liked most ("The Cat in the Hat" from Wednesday and "One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish" on Thursday), they chose which story they wanted to display for the Dr. Seuss Book Parade. The children chose "One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish". If you have any ideas on how to celebrate the children's book choice, please let us know. You can email us your ideas or simply write your suggestion and place it in your communication folder.

March

Interestingly enough, our study in March is "Pets." If you have a pet, we will need your empty and clean pet-food containers, plastic or stuffed animals, cardboard shoe boxes, and maybe pet toys.

We will follow your children's interest if they want to make a pet store or animal hospital. This will extend their literacy, math, science, and social study skills. For families that have a pet, please take a picture of your animal.

We can use pictures to make a small classroom book for your children to read or look at. If you are able to donate some items, please label them with your name so we can return them to you at the end of the study. I have some stuffed animals that I can bring for the children to explore and learn about.

Student achievements/milestones:

Seventy-five percent of the children can recognize the letters in their first name with no help or looking at their name and 25% can recognize the letters in their first name with little help.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Your child may have been exposed to pink eye (conjunctivitis).

General information:

Pink eye is a condition that causes inflammation of the eye. It can be caused by bacteria, viruses, or allergens, or if something gets in the eye (such as chemicals or dirt). Viral and bacterial conjunctivitis are very contagious, spreading easily to others.

What are the symptoms?

One or both eyes may have:

- ·Pink or red color in the white of the eye
- ·Swelling of the conjunctiva (the tissue that lines the white part of the eye and inside the eyelid) and/or eyelids
- ·Itching, irritation, and/or burning feeling in the eye
- ·Eye drainage (clear, thick white, yellow or green), crusting of eyelids or lashes, especially in the morning

What do I need to do?

- ·Watch your child for signs and symptoms of the disease
- ·If your child develops symptoms, please call your healthcare provider, inform the school, and keep your child home. Please follow your health care provider's instructions for home care and to prevent the spread of disease to others

Pink eye is easily spread by hands that have touched infected eyes, drainage from the eyes, or by touching contaminated items.

How do I prevent this disease?

- ·Avoid touching your eyes
- ·Wash hands often
- ·Disinfect objects frequently touched

When can someone with pink eye return to school/childcare?

Children with symptoms of pink eye are to be excluded from school until they have clearance from a healthcare provider. Those that have infectious pink eye may return to school with a doctor's clearance and, if prescribed, completion of 24 hours of antibiotics.

The Laguna Division of Early Childhood program provides a rich and engaging setting for all early learners-infants up to preschoolers, including any child who may be exhibiting a developmental delay in any of the following areas: large or small muscle development, in communication/language development, or social/emotional development. Sometimes parents/families may have concerns when their child's development may seem delayed or slower than expected.

TIPG:

CREATING ROUTINES FOR LEARNING

Daily routines offer the chance to build self-confidence, curiosity, social-skills, self-control communication skills and more. Routines help babies, toddlers and preschoolers learn self-control. Consistent routines, activities that happen at the same time and in the same way each day, provide comfort and a sense of safety to young children. Routines help your child/children predict what will happen next. Routines also support and develop children's social skills.

<u>Examples of simple routines that are learning opportunities:</u>

*Playtime & mealtimes are two routines that are very social times for both children and parents. Through talking, taking turns, sharing toys, learning to wait, young children learn important social skills that will help them later in life.

PLEASE NOTE: Routines provide the two ingredients for learning-*Relationships and * Repetition!

Greetings Families,

Happy March! Hope you are well and staying healthy. It is the time of year when the plants and trees are beginning to wake back up for another season. With that said, allergies are in full bloom, please be cautious of your child's health. If students become ill, consider taking them to the doctor to get checked, and provide DEC with a doctor's excuse.

Also, if you have not submitted documents for your child's file at school, please do so, at your earliest convenience. Reminders have been sent home in the students' folders and have been included in newsletters.

It is important to keep up to date on your child's file here at DEC. The federal funding we receive requires checks and balances, one of which is maintaining student files and making sure they have current documents within their files. The items to be included with their application are birth certificate, current immunization record, and current well child check. There is a 45-day period available from the student's first day of school to submit documentation. For most, that deadline was September 27th, 2024. Since then, we have yet to receive all documents from each student. As students continue their education through elementary school and middle school, the same information will be needed as well.

If you would like to inquire about missing documents, feel free to contact me.
