- 1. Cafeteria/Commons, room, time and seating capacity (Lunch from 10 am 1pm)
  - 2. All the Roofs
- 3. Student Safety. Traffic flow within buildings and eliminate corners, entry control at air lock
- 4. Exterior Aesthetics, dangerous trees, blocking views, removing clutter everywhere
  - 5. Modern Appropriate updated classrooms, tech, furniture
- 6. Consolidation and modernization of athletic facilities, weight room, gyms, locker rooms, fields, stadium

All these priorities are equal in need

- 1. Heating, Cooling and Filtration, classrooms at comfortable temperature and not breathing in mold etc..
- 2. Safety and Security. Upgrading Restrooms to be like commons, getting fences up and around. This is not a second priority, it is a top priority.
- 3. Eliminate the spin room and could it become the temp weight room
- 4. Physical Appearance, drive onto the campus, building entries

- 1. Exterior Portfolio
- 2. Hot Water Storage
- 3. Mold Mitigation
- 4. Any construction we need asbestos and lead paint mitigating at a huge cost
- 5. Interior Ceilings

If we don't expand to a new school, budget to repair modulars and use a grant for venting in the welding shop. It's really hard to quantify the cost of hazardous materials like mold etc.. there is a little cost in soft cost for some of the abatement
