

#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL



The statewide indoor mask requirement for Washington state, including in our K–12 schools, is now scheduled to end on March 12, 2022. Once the statewide requirement is lifted, masks will become optional for students/staff. They will have the choice to wear a mask at school, with the expectation that others' choices will be respected. One should not make assumptions regarding someone's beliefs or health status, nor should they comment on them.

#### Until March 12, masks will continue to be required for all

**students, staff, and visitors in school.** Masks will continue to be provided for those who do not have them, and students who will not wear masks will be sent home. Pe Ell School District and our Board of Directors do not have local control over this matter. We are legally required to follow the Governor's directive, which currently requires masks in school buildings.

Starting Monday, February 28 until March 10, HS/MS students may have the option to Zoom to the classroom remotely to participate in each class/discussion. They must participate in each class 70% or 40 minutes to meet attendance requirements. Please give advance notice to teachers for remote intentions. Zoom information will be available on Google Classroom.

In the coming days, we will have available support staff to discuss the concerns or anxiety students may have. We thank you for your continued flexibility as we navigate this pandemic. We are anticipating receiving additional information from public health officials in the coming weeks. We will continue communicating with you as we learn about changes to the guidance for our district.


