Implementing mitigation activities, responding to periods of increased transmission, resuming baseline level mitigation, and debriefing actions to improve the process

Planning for and implementing proactive health and safety mitigation measures assists schools in reducing communicable disease transmission within the school environment for students, staff, and community members. Communicable disease, including norovirus, flu and COVID-19, will continue to circulate in our communities and our schools. Schools will utilize different mitigation measures based on local data, and observation of what is happening in their schools (e.g., transmission within their facilities and communities.) OHA/ODE Recommendation(s) Layered Health and Safety Measures	Describe what mitigating measures the school will implement to reduce and respond to the spread of communicable disease and protect in-person instruction?	
Immunizations	CDC, OHA, and ODE recommend COVID-19 vaccination for all eligible individuals. Our district may offer the Covid- 19 vaccine along with the flu vaccine in the fall. Staff will be notified of any immunization clinics if/when arranged by our community partners. Shots are required by law for children in attendance at public and private schools, preschools, child care facilities, and Head Start programs in Oregon. Nearly every place that provides care for a child outside the home <u>requires shots</u> or a <u>medical</u> or <u>nonmedical exemption</u> to stay enrolled.	
Face Coverings	For the 2023-2024 school year, face coverings are not required. A face covering may be offered to an individual who exhibits respiratory symptoms while at school when waiting for transport home.	
Isolation	Rainier School District students and staff who report or develop symptoms of a communicable illness while at school or in an educational program will be isolated in the Student Services Center or in a delegated nursing space at Hudson Park Elementary, Rainier JRSR High, or the district nurse office (which has adequate space and staff supervision), will be provided a face covering, and symptoms will be monitored by a school nurse, other school-based health care provider or trained school/program staff until they are able to go home.	
Symptom Screening	Any student or staff who develop illness symptoms while at school will be sent to the school office or nurse's office for further evaluation. School exclusion will be based on symptoms as defined in the <u>Communicable</u> Disease Guidelines for Schools.	
COVID-19 Diagnostic Testing	The Rainier School District may offer Covid-19 testing if the program is supported through the ODE.	
Airflow and Circulation	Rainier School District will operate ventilation systems properly and/or increase circulation of outdoor air as much as possible by opening windows and doors, using fans, and through other methods. The Rainier School District will consider running ventilation systems continuously and changing the filters more frequently where appropriate. All classrooms will utilize additional air purifiers in the classroom to provide additional air filtration. Ventilation systems will be checked regularly.	
Cohorting	Schools, programs and facilities will strive to support cohorting in all daily activities and instruction when practical and when advised by our local public health authority during times of increased communicable disease transmission in our county.	
Physical Distancing	Schools, programs and facilities will strive to support physical distancing in all daily activities and instruction when practical and when advised by our local public health authority during times of increased communicable disease transmission in our county.

Hand Washing	times when hands are dirty. Respiratory etiquette means covering coughs and sneezes with an elbow or a tissue. Tissues should be disposed of in a garbage can, then hands washed or sanitized immediately.
Cleaning and Disinfection	All classrooms, shared spaces, and other areas throughout campus will be cleaned/sanitized daily.
Training and Public Health Education	Danielle Nelson, RN (District Nurse) is the point of contact for public health and will be communicating with Columbia County Public Health about any reportable communicable disease and/or illness outbreaks. Danielle Nelson, RN will be tracking illnesses of staff as appropriate. All public health recommendations will be followed. Staff training will be conducted throughout the year.

PRACTICING PLAN TO BE READY

Training exercises are essential to preparedness ensuring individuals understand their role in a communicable disease event. Exercises can also help identify gaps in the planning, thereby building upon and strengthening the plan over time. Schools, districts, and ESDs should schedule to exercise this plan annually and when any revisions are made to update the plan. The plan, or component(s) of the plan, can be tested through conversations, practice exercises, or other activities.
