


### Classroom Reminders


- Characteristics of fiction/non-fiction works

## Georgia Milestone Assessments

- This year your child will be taking the Georgia Milestone Assessments.
  - These assessments are online and last about a week in April.

#### Reading

Students will be reading passages and answering a variety of multiple choice and constructed response questions. Students will also be required to write a narrative response during this assessment.

#### Writing

O Students will be asked to read a passage and respond using text evidence. This could be an opinion or an informational writing task.

#### O Math

Students will be asked to use what they have learned in math this year to solve equations and word problems. There will also be a few written response questions that will require them to explain their thinking.
