

Identification Process

Step 1: Referral:

- A screening test is given to all students in 1st and 3rd grade, with parent permission.
- Individual referral addresses those students who are indereferred.

Step 2: LSC Review of Referral Data

The Gifted LSC will meet and determine if student meets required criteria to be tested.

Step 3: Parent Permission for Testing

District personnel shall obtain written parental consent for testing.

Step 4: Assessment

The individual test of intelligence will be administered by Webster County School District licensed examiner. Students who score at or above the 91st percentile on the full scale IQ test.

Step 5: LSC Eligibility Determination

Once the written Assessment Report is compiled on the student, the LSC shall meet to review all data and determine if eligibility criteria have or have not been satisfied.
