GRADING POLICY:

This class follows the DeSoto County Schools Grading Policy.

CLASSWORK 35%	This includes all work completed in class and quizzes.
HOMEWORK 15%	Students will complete a spiral review each week that reviews previously taught material. The goal is to keep material fresh on students' minds as we go throughout the year.
TESTS 40%	Tests will be taken at the end of each unit. Dates are posted at least a week in advance on the monthly calendar.
NINE WEEKS	A district-created nine weeks test is given at the end of each nine-weeks.

LATE WORK:

Late work is accepted for *partial* credit. Students, your work is your responsibility. If you turn in something late that is an *online* assignment, you must turn in an orange slip with your name, date, and assignment title so that I know to go look for that assignment.

MAKE-UP WORK:

If you are absent, it is your responsibility to make sure you get your missed work. Your missed work will be placed in the absent bin folder that matches the corresponding date that you missed. If you miss multiple days, you will need to check multiple folders.

INTERACTIVE NOTEBOOKS:
