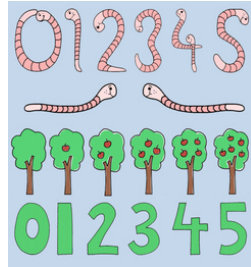


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TTK and Kindergarten

Kindergarten is finishing up our second chapter in math comparing and writing numbers 0-5. Students are learning how to find if a number is greater or lesser than another number by comparing the two numbers. We are also working on finding number pairs that equal each number. For example, number pairs for five are 1+4, 0+5, 2+3, 3+2, and so on.



Kindergarteners are continuing to learn pre-reading skills. We are listening for the beginning, middle, and end sounds of short words. For example, fish- "f", "i", "sh". You can work with your child by asking them to identify the first and last sounds in words.



TK is learning how to sort items based on different criteria. They analyze different objects and place them in groups. TK students are also learning about Goldilocks.

First and Second Grade Explorers

1st/2nd Grade Evaline Explorers go swimming next week! Please remember to return your permission slip if you have not already. Also, please have your child bring his/her **swimsuit, a plastic bag, and a towel** every day next week. We have found it is easiest if students wear their swimsuits under their clothes to school. If they do this, have them pack undergarments with their towels.

Students should now know what a sentence is. They are beginning to write paragraphs. Try telling fun stories in the car or around the dinner table. Try to include a beginning, middle, and end as you tell these stories.



First grade students continue their subtraction studies as second graders understand three digit numbers and modeling. Please keep practicing basic computation with your child and explore story problems if you have a chance.

In science, students are studying earth materials. They should now understand what the water cycle is.
