**Bus Changes will be posted on Notify Me through the school website. We encourage parents to sign up for notifications.**



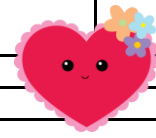

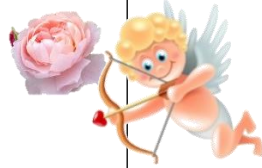

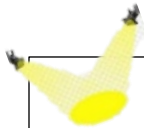
