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
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#### Elizabeth Miller






# How can I contact my child's teacher?

If a student is making a choice that is unsafe for others, I may evacuate others from the classroom or he/she may be removed from the classroom setting. I take students' learning time and safety very seriously and it is my sincere hope that no one will have to leave the classroom. I will contact you if he/she is having difficulty managing personal choices.

# what happens if my child needs to miss school?

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The fifth grade curriculum is demanding and your child's attendance is critical to his/her success. If he/she needs to miss school we will send make-up work. Unfortunately, a great deal of our learning experience cannot be replaced outside of the classroom. Excessive absences impact a child's progress.
