What is Title I?

Temple Middle is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family

engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Temple Middle will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Temple Middle values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Temple Middle will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school, home and virtually.

How is it revised?

Temple Middle School invited all parents to attend 23-24 final input meeting for an input on all Title I forms including the Parent/Family Engagement Plan. That information was brought into the design of the plan for 24-25. All parents were invited to Open House 6th/7th/8th grade session on July 31, 2024, as well as to our Title I Input meeting on August 21, 2024 at 5:15 PM - 5:00 PM to review and revise this parent & family engagement policy, the school wide plan, our school-parent compact, Building Staff Capacity, and the 1% family engagement budget. All parents were invited to attend our Annual Title I meeting on August 21, 2024 at 5:00 pm - 5:15 pm. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through emailing the school family engagement coordinator. The plan is posted on our school website for parents and community members to view and submit feedback throughout the year. A final input meeting will be held at the end of the school year for any final parental input on April 15, 2025 at 5 PM. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year. If the school wide program plan is not satisfactory to the parents of TMS students, parents can submit comments on the plan to the district Title I representative at www.carrollcountyschools.com.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Temple Middle will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children. Parents unable to attend due to transportation or childcare limitations will be provided transportation and childcare if the school is notified of the need ahead of time.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan will be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center, located in Student Services. The plan will be available in English and Spanish. Translation in another language is an option if notification is given in advance.

2024-2025 District Goals Our Goals for Student Achievement:

Academic District goals

To increase the number of students scoring at proficient and distinguished on the GMAS by 3% and to increase the GMAS scores for ELL, ED, and SWD by 6%.

2024-2025 School Goals

TMS will focus on improving GMAS Math by showing .9 months of growth on the STAR Math by the end of April. This will be accomplished by improving areas of focus in 6th gr Ratios & Proportions, 7th gr Statistics & Probability, and 8th gr Geometry.

TMS will focus on improving by:

- Focusing on lessons in Desmos Math & weekly SAFES using Edulastic to remediate and/or accelerate students to monitor progress
- Teachers will offer tutoring during one of their planning periods to work with students for remediation or acceleration in the areas of, but not limited to, Ratios & Proportions, Statistics & Probability, and Geometry

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Temple Middle and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. 
Parent and Family Engagement Standards
