Fall Food Drive

Our school is gathering food for our 5th annual Food Drive beginning Thursday, November 13th, until Thursday, December 4th. Students in grades 5-6 will be delivering the food to the Winlock Vader Food Bank on Friday December 5th directly following our all school morning meeting. We encourage our students to talk with their family members about what they can bring to school for this community service project. The goal for our school is to bring in over 160 items (approx 2 items per student / staff member). We are asking students to donate new pre-packaged or canned food items, which can include favorite food items that other children might enjoy, or easy meal makers such as tuna helper with tuna. The food bank currently is completely out of chili, canned soup, stew, and baked beans, so they would particularly appreciate having these types of items donated. Students can also donate unopened cat and dog food. We are emphasizing the cooperative, service, and gratitude aspects of this project this year, so our focus will be based on meeting this goal and need together. 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TK and Kindergarten

This week in Kindergarten, students are learning the letters v, p, e, and z while continuing to review previously introduced letter sounds. Several students have begun reading BOB Books, which are early readers designed to reinforce the phonics skills we're practicing in class.

We also wrapped up our unit on The Five Senses. Students explored how each sense helps us in our daily lives and learned about Ray Charles and Helen Keller, two inspiring individuals who accomplished amazing things despite challenges with one or more senses.

In math, kindergarteners are working with numbers 1–10, using the terms greater than and less than to compare quantities.

Our Transitional Kindergarten (TK) class has just begun the Animals unit! Students are discovering different types of animals and learning how they survive in their environments. They are also beginning to practice writing their names. In math, TK students are exploring shapes and their attributes.

Please look for a copy of the script in your child's Boomerang Folder. This copy can stay at home so they can practice, practice, practice. Your child's part should be highlighted.

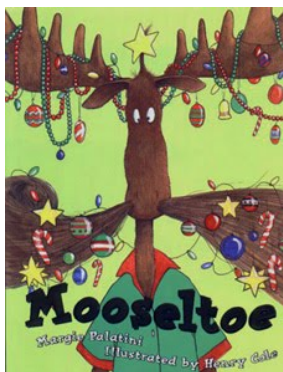
