Happy Resurrection Sunday! Next week, I will be away for our annual Diocesan Priest Retreat. Please keep us in prayer as we gather for prayer, formation, rest, and fraternity.

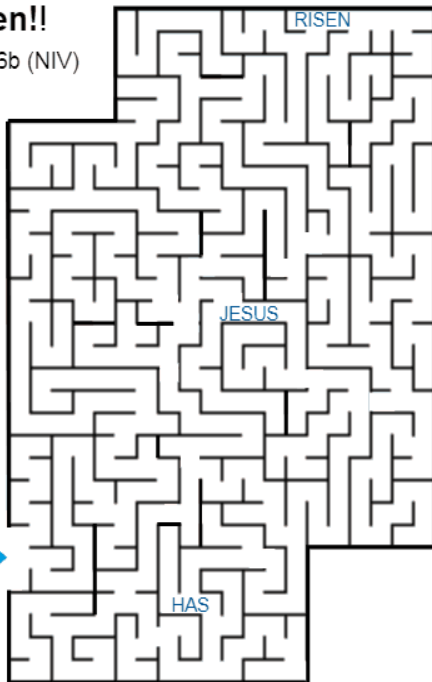

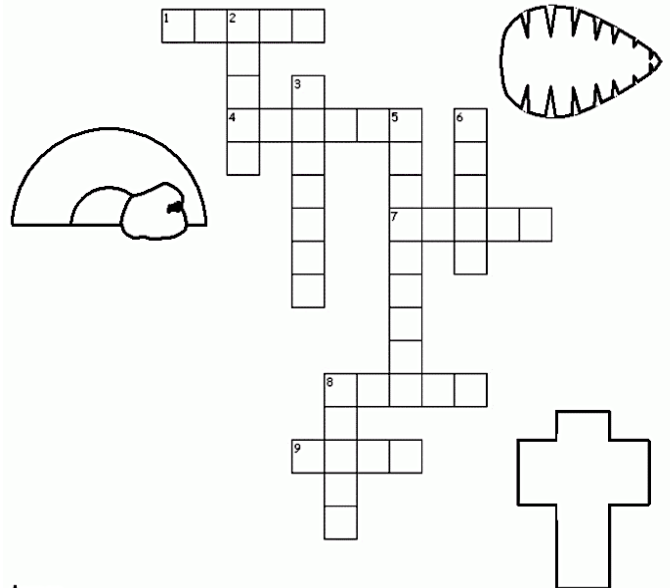
