TK and Kindergarten

Welcome back from break! I hope you all had a restful time. It was certainly well deserved, and I enjoyed hearing from students about their experiences.

In Kindergarten, students are continuing to build their reading comprehension skills. During this unit, they are learning key vocabulary from our short stories by writing definitions and creating illustrations. After reading each story, students respond to comprehension questions and are practicing how to express their answers in complete sentences.

Our TK students are exploring habitats, with a focus on the desert and the animals that live there. This has been an especially engaging unit, as it incorporates a variety of creative, art-based activities.

In math, Kindergarten students are learning to identify and describe two-dimensional shapes. TK students are concluding their unit on comparing objects. One highlight was a musical chairs activity, which helped them understand the concept of not having enough for everyone in a fun and memorable way.

I would also like to recognize the wonderful effort shown during our March Read-a-Thon. Many students met—and even exceeded—their personal reading goals, allowing our class to successfully reach our overall goal. Congratulations to Henry and Isla for being our top readers!

First and Second Grade Explorers

It was so nice to have our students back this week!

1st graders are reading a narrative about a little girl named Kate and are working on 3-dimensional shapes. 2nd graders are finishing a funny tale titled “Sir Gus” and are studying aspects of geometry. Students are also learning about moon phases and space and using logic grids.

Families, students are struggling to find the author's purpose and conduct analytical thinking in their reading texts. It would be very helpful if, as students read aloud for 30 minutes each night, they read with expression. Expression demonstrates deeper understanding of who the characters in a story are as well as the characters’ actions.

5th grade is working through a chapter on fraction multiplication and division. This week they got to divide fractions by fractions and whole numbers by fractions. 6th grade is learning about statistics. They’ve examined what makes a statistical question, how to describe the data they’ve collected and how to create and interpret charts from data. They will continue next week into mean, median, and mode calculations and eventually into whisker box data sets.
