Dear Parishioners,

As of writing this note, we are still waiting to see when our new music teacher will have what is needed to come to our country and state to teach. He seems to be a dynamic, faith-filled man that is joy-filled. I am certain that he will teach our students well, and I look forward to the different approach he may take to teaching based on his Ghanaian culture and African experience.

The organization Mrs. Garvey is working with in sponsoring him is helping with the process, having properly vetted him, and now it is up to the consulates and State Department to grant him a visa (which will be valid for 3 years). I hope that when he comes, we will give him a warm welcome and help him to adjust to life here. I am sure that he will share with many more about his culture, and we will be richer for learning from him.

In this process, I hope that we can see the difference between legal and illegal migration. He is going through the process of being vetted, assure that he is not a criminal or that he is who he says he is regarding being a music teacher. He is being examined for his ability to be here, earn his living and provide for himself. He will add to our growth.

On the other side, we hear of many cross the border illegally, some with criminal records or for nefarious purposes. As I was reminded, 9/11 was perpetrated by 11 men... a small group of ne'er-do-wells can wreak havoc. Certainly, this is not every person crossing the border illegally. In addition, statistically those who are doing so are net drains as they have no jobs, rely on local government for food and housing, and often undercut other laborers if they are willing to work.

These issues need to be thought of as we enter the polls. Certainly, legal immigration is a good thing, but for those with legitimate reasons – either because they provide a needed skill or because of legitimate concerns for their safety (for example, those that would be put to death because they oppose the Communist regime in power). Certainly, until they are full citizens, while they have the same basic human rights, the right to vote should be withheld. It is preposterous to think that we could simply live in another country and expect to vote there, so why should the opposite be true. Certainly, too, even those here having

overstayed their visas or have cross illegally need to be treated with human decency.

These issues are complicated, and our response needs to be balanced. We need to treat all humanely, but humanely speaking, one might make the case that we as a nation are unable to continue to allow so many to skirt the law, and especially those who are here for further illegal activity, whether sex or drug trafficking, or to murder, rape or maim, need to be found and sent to their country of origin before more damage is soon.

REFLECTION ~ Think about this ...

It is a maxim of the spiritual life that the depth of a person's prayer is proportionate to the person's holiness of life. As such, our state of holiness is related to how we worship at Mass.

The spiritual masters have spoken of four dispositions of the soul necessary to make mental prayer successful.

Let us reflect on the first two today: purity of conscience and purity of heart. We obtain purity of conscience when we learn to hate sin deeply and are ever watchful to not offend God out of love. To obtain purity of conscience we must learn humility from our faults and be quick to repent and amend them. This means that we must not grow discouraged when we fall but trust in God's help and continue with firm resolution.

We obtain purity of heart when we are no longer attached to sin, but love God with our whole hearts. If our heart prefers something else before God, it will be divided. The more we are detached from sin, the more we will honor God when we receive him, and the more we will be open to accepting his grace.

Learn from the Good Shepherd how to care for others.

Let us pray.

Lord, you are ever present to us to give us what we need. Grant us the grace to live a life of trust so that we may be free to give of ourselves after your example. We ask this in your most holy name. Amen.
