Title I--Parent Involvement

- **Involve** parents in a meaningful way in the development, implementation, and review of the parental involvement program.
- **Convene** an annual meeting to inform parents of Title I students of Title I requirements and their rights to be involved in the Title I program.
- **Provide** parents of Title I students with timely information about Title I programs.
- **Assist** parents in understanding academic content standards, assessments, and how to monitor and improve the achievement of their children.
- **Provide** materials and training to help Title I parents work with their children to improve their children's achievement

Title I law requires that all Title I schools and families work together.

- ◆ School Wide Title I Plan (School Improvement Plan)

Title I School-Wide Plans

At each school, teams meet to develop the Title I School Wide Plan for the year. They look at the following data to develop the plan:

- Comprehensive needs assessment results
- Standardized test scores and other academic performance data
- Attendance and discipline data
- Perception data (including parent surveys)

- Instructional technology (i.e. smartboards, tablets, laptop labs, instructional software)
- Additional teachers and paraprofessionals
- Partial salary for academic coaches
- Professional learning activities for teachers
- After school programs
- Parental involvement activities
