### **STATE ESSER 2 Reserve**

Each LEA has already received award letters indicating funds available through ESSER 1 and ESSER 2. Additionally, the ALSDE is making available a portion of its ESSER State Reserve Funds to every LEA funds for two purposes: (1) formative student assessment in Grades 4-8 for mathematics and reading at a rate of \$12 per student and (2) course of study professional development in Mathematics and English Language Arts.

Base allocations will be provided for:  A) Elementary Teachers (K-5) - \$400 for registration, materials, substitutes for follow-up trainings or PLCs.  B) Secondary Teachers (6-12) - \$1,050 for registration, materials, substitutes for follow-up trainings or PLCs.	\$223,850
Assessment Award for Grades 4-8**: This allocation is being granted to extend each school's early reading and math assessment system through Grade 8. The allocation will be \$12 per student based on each school's 2020-2021 ADM.	\$52,770
