Review

1. During Saul's reign, the Samuel was close to God and told the people what God wanted them to do.
2. God told Saul to destroy the people of Amalek and all their possessions.
3. Saul said that he did not destroy all their possessions because he wanted to use the best of their possessions as a sacrifice to the Lord.
4. According to 1 Samuel 15:22–23, obediences better than sacrifice.
5. In 1 Samuel 15, God compares rebellion to the sin of divination or witchcraft.
6. God rejected Saul from being king because Saul had rejected God's word.
7. God told Samuel that he would find Israel's next king among the sons of Jesse.
