

PLEASE KEEP ILL STUDENTS OUT OF SCHOOL

The list below gives school instructions, not medical advice. Please contact your healthcare provider with health concerns.

Anyone exposed to COVID-19 must stay home for 14 days.

Student's Symptoms or Illness	Student May Return to School After: *The list below shows the shortest time to stay home with no known exposure to COVID-19. The time may be extended for some illnesses.
Fever: temperature greater than 100.4 degrees OR is having chills.	*No fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever- reducing medicine AND after a COVID-19 test from a medical provider is negative, OR 10 days if not tested. Student must not be actively sick.
Cough (persistent cough that is not yet diagnosed and cleared by a licensed healthcare provider OR any acute cough illness OR cough that is frequent or severe enough to interfere with participation in usual school activities) OR difficulty breathing/shortness of breath.	*Symptoms improving AND after a COVID-19 test from a medical provider is negative, OR 10 days if not tested. If diagnosed with pertussis (whooping cough), the student must take 5 days of a prescribed antibiotic before returning. Student must not be actively sick.
Headache with a stiff neck or fever	*Symptom-free OR with orders from a medical provider to school nurse. Follow fever instructions if fever is present.
Diarrhea: 3 loose or watery stools in one day OR newly developed not able to control bowel movements.	*Symptom-free for 48 hours OR with orders from a medical provider to school nurse. Student must not be actively sick.
Vomiting: one or more episode that is unexplained.	*Symptom-free for 48 hours OR with orders from a medical provider to school nurse. Student must not be actively sick.
Skin rash or open sores	*Symptom-free , rash is gone OR sores are dry or can be completely covered by a bandage OR with orders from a medical provider to school nurse.
Jaundice: (new) yellow color in eyes or skin	*After school has orders from a medical provider or local public health authority to school nurse.
Red eyes with eye discharge: yellow or brown drainage from eyes.	*Symptom-free , redness and discharge is gone OR with orders from a medical provider to school nurse.
Acting different without a reason: unusually sleepy or grumpy OR acting differently after a head injury.	*Symptom-free , after return to normal behavior OR with orders from a medical provider to school nurse.
Major health event: illness lasting 2 or more weeks OR a hospital stay.	*After the school has orders from a medical provider to school nurse.
Student's health condition requires more care than school staff can safely provide.	*After measures are in place for student's safety.
