French 1A

Description of Target Group

French 1A is the first semester of a two-semester course designed as an elective for students of all grade levels.

Purpose

French 1A is designed to enable students to communicate in French, to appreciate and respect other people; gain self respect; gain communication and writing skills in French; and become familiar with the cultures of French speaking peoples. Credit earned will contribute to the college entrance foreign language requirement as required by the A-F university requirements.

Standards of Expected Student Achievement

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to successfully demonstrate the following skills:

- 1. Develop listening comprehension in French.
- 2. Imitate French sentences with appropriate pronunciation, intonation, and fluency.
- 3. Communicate orally and in written form about simple personal information dealing with the student, others in the class, and the student's family.
- 4. Answer questions based on oral and written selections.
- 5. Write French correctly.
- 6. Learn the meanings of and be able to use in questions and answers the following topics:
 - a. Objects in the classroom
 - b. Numbers, currency
 - c. Days of week, months of year, dates, time
 - d. Food
 - e. Nationalities
 - f. Weather
- 7. Demonstrate the ability to use orally and in written form the following grammatical concepts:
 - a. Definite and indefinite articles
 - b. Gender and number
 - c. Present indicative of the irregular verbs "avoir", "aller" and "être" in the affirmative, negative and interrogative forms
 - d. Pronouns subject, disjunctive (stress)
 - e. Grammatical concepts within the limits of the textbook

Credit earned will contribute to the college entrance foreign language requirement as required by the A-F university requirements.

 - c. Idiomatic expression "il y a" in the affirmative and negative
 - d. "Futur proche" using the verbe "aller" plus the infinitive
 - e. Passé composé of regular verbs with "avoir"
 - f. Grammatical concepts within the limits of the textbook, including possessives, prepositions, and adjectives.
 - g. Maintain a French no tebook
