


HCCA Advanced HVACR Pathway

They are learning how to wire series and parallel circuits and learning the relationships that voltage, current and resistance have for the different circuits being wired. Once the boards are properly wired not only are they able to measure with a volt ohm meter the interactions of the above mentioned Volts, Ohms and Resistances, but they will also be able to see it visually as well. They will also be learning how to use Ohms law to calculate the values.

FIRST Robotics Competition (FRC) is the high school league category of For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology (FIRST). FIRST is a global robotics community preparing young people for the future and the world's leading youth-serving nonprofit advancing STEM education. The Houston County Career Academy (HCCA) hosts The Flying Legion, FRC team 3635, which has a stellar competition history at both state and world level. This is a cross-county team, where all Houston County High School students are welcome to compete. All team practices, robot builds, and testing events are held at HCCA, located at the corner of Russell Parkway and Corder Road.

The Georgia Robotics Invitational Tournament and Showcase (also known as GRITS) is an annual off-season event. This year, it was held at the National Fairgrounds and Agricenter in Perry, the McGill Marketplace building, on Friday and Saturday, 29 - 30 October 2021. Competition teams were limited to 10 students and two adults. Team 3635 finished in 8th place, out of 28 teams during regular competition and was eliminated during the quarter finals. Team 3635 is advised by Michael Marcoux of HCCA and Lt Col (ret) Jessica Chapman of Veterans High School. The team held a 6-4 record during the GRITS competition.







MCMS FCCLA Helping Hands

During the pandemic of 2020-21, we have all learned how to do things differently. This is no exception with all personnel of our school system. The Houston County School System courageously started back to school with both an in-person learning option and a virtual learning option on August 6th, 2021. Although most parents chose the in-person learning option, which has proven to be very successful, there are approximately 4,900 Houston County virtual learners. Included with the virtual learning option are the lunch and breakfast meals that the students would have received if they were attending classes in person.

Every Wednesday is the designated, weekly pick-up day for the parents of the virtual learners to pick up meals for those students. Families receive meals for the entire week at each pick-up time. Every Wednesday, parents receive breakfast meals and lunch meals for every virtual student. Included in the meals are four cups of fruit and vegetables. Along with the fruits and vegetables, the weekly required proteins, dairy, and breads are also included. The lunch and breakfast menu changes each week just like the in-person students' menu changes. This is an enormous logistical task, and Mrs. McGahee Cafeteria manager at MCMS, estimates that a minimum of eight hours per week are required to prepare for the virtual meal pick-up.

To help with this task, a perfect partnership was formed. Sherry Sheppard, the FACS teacher at MCMS and FCCLA Adviser, was approached with a question that eventually turned into a wonderful, daily learning experience for students and FCCLA members. The question: "Mrs. Sheppard, do you think some of your students would want to help with our virtual meal preparation?" Mrs. Sheppard was overwhelmed with joy to hear this question and very eager to say, "Yes!" Not only did this fit in beautifully with the FACS curriculum, but it also provided a plethora of FCCLA learning opportunities. FCCLA focuses on teaching employability skills, developing leaders, communication skills and being proactive in helping out others. This was a perfect way to involve FCCLA members in experiencing a true hands-on, learning opportunity. This is the embodiment of learning employability skills, leadership traits, responsibility, dependability, communication skills, and teamwork.

FCCLA members worked in the Cafeteria every day for 50 minute except Wednesday. They had to wear proper attire including hair nets, apron, mask and gloves. Some of the task were measuring food products out, placing them in proper containers, keeping a product count and communication to adults and each other on the task at hand.

The FCCLA members really enjoyed this experience and it was a fantastic opportunity. They are all thankful for the opportunity that the FCCLA members had. They learned the invaluable skills needed to work in any future career field. It was a hands-on experience that will have a lifetime impact and an awesome middle school memory.
