



## **Cushing ISD Press Release November 16, 2021**

The Cushing Independent School District Board of Trustees is happy to announce the naming of Dr. Brandon Enos as its Lone Finalist for the position of Superintendent. Dr. Enos is currently the Assistant Superintendent for Goliad ISD, a district serving approximately 1,200 students.

Dr. Enos began his career as an educator in 2007, after serving eight years in the U.S. Army. Dr. Enos taught Social Studies and PE at Castleberry ISD before transitioning into school administration for Kermit ISD in 2018. He has served as an assistant principal, campus principal, central office administrator and university instructor at Western Governor's University. Dr. Enos earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in social studies education from the University of Central Oklahoma (B.A.E), his master's degree in educational leadership (M.S.E.) from Grand Canyon University, and his Doctorate in Education (Ed.D.) from American College of Education.

Prior to his tenure in Goliad ISD, Dr. Enos was recognized as the 2010 Social Studies Teacher of the Year in Hawaii. He has served on the TASBO Instructional Materials Committee and Rotary Club Vice-President. Dr. Enos regularly shares educational best practices at local and state conferences, where he has been asked to speak on school safety, student interventions, and recruiting and retaining school teachers in rural Texas.

Dr. Enos stated, "I am extremely honored to be named as the Lone-Finalist for the position of Superintendent for the Cushing Independent School District. I look forward to partnering with the students, teachers, staff, families, and community to ensure that our schools are effective in not only meeting but exceeding the needs of our students." Dr. Enos and his wife, Sarah, have four children – Kodey (24), Bradly (22), Abigail (20) and Troy (14).

The Cushing ISD Board began its search in July after long-time Superintendent Dr. Michael Davis resigned to take a position with the Region 7 Education Service Center. The Board reviewed a significant number of applications for the position and selected Dr. Enos after interviewing multiple qualified candidates.

Board President Lynn Moore stated, "We are so excited that Dr. Brandon Enos has accepted the Board's offer to be our District's Lone Finalist for the position of Superintendent of Schools. After seeking community input, this Board worked many hours and spent many late nights searching for the right candidate. We believe we have found that in Dr. Enos and look forward to his energy and enthusiasm as he continues to advance the traditions and high standards of the Bearkat community." Texas law requires a 21-day waiting period after naming the lone finalist before the superintendent can be hired.
