
# Step 1: Create & Claim Your Account



# **Step 2: Adding Your Courses**

- Log In to the MyMAC portal with your Username and Password once your account is claimed: <a href="https://portal.mtaloy.edu/ICS/">https://portal.mtaloy.edu/ICS/</a>
- 2. Select the "Students" tab at the top of the page, then select "Online Registration" from the left menu.
- 3. You are now on the Course Search page. Select the "More Search Options" link at the bottom of the course search box.
- 4. All high school students will select **2024-2025 Winter Alternate** under "Term". Select your school district under "Campus".
- 5. Check the add box next to the course/courses that need registered. Scroll to bottom of the page and click "Save."
- Once you have saved the courses you wish to add, no further action is needed.
