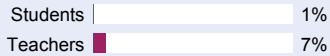

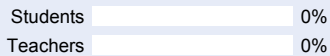

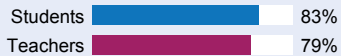

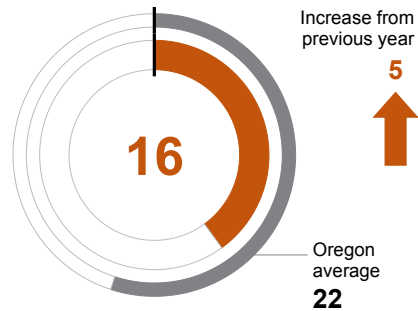

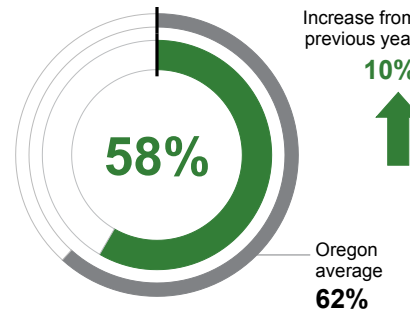
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

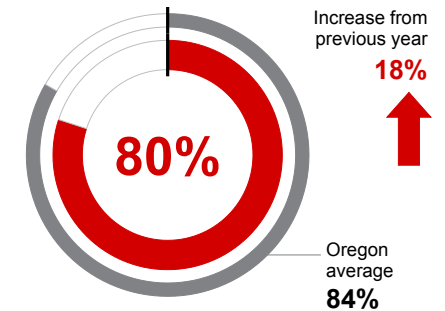
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

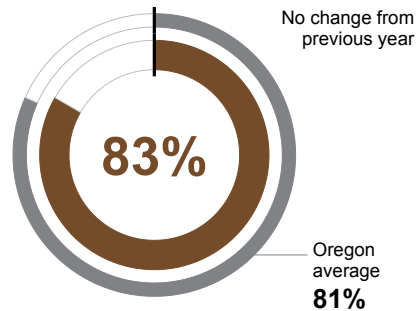
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.

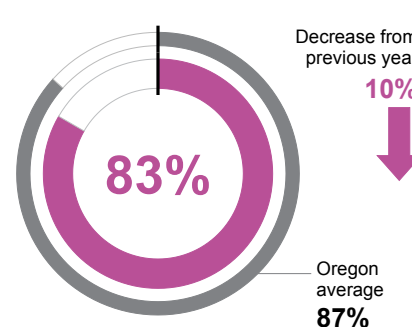
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2018-19 graduating in 2021-22.



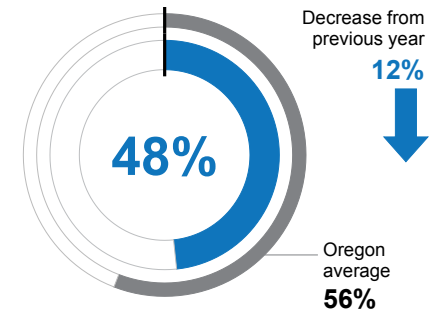
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

School Goals

Our vision is for all learners to rise to the opportunities and challenges of the world. The District continues to support its athletic and co-curricular programs, including expanded options in music, visual arts, dance, and drama. The District is working to expand career and technical education programs to include more female participants. We work hard to communicate with our community and build trusting relationships.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

Knappa High School is a safe community where people care about one another. As a small high school, we know all students well and the school feels like a family. We have a full time counselor, excellent relations with law enforcement, we provide an advisory program, and we maintain small class sizes. About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

- Knappa High School provides the following advanced coursework opportunities:
 - advanced placement courses
 - college in the high school
 - opportunities to take classes at Clatsop Community College (CCC) and Southern Oregon University
 - career and technical options at the CCC Merts Campus
 - classes beyond our regular program through online classes at ORVED (sponsored by Northwest Regional Education Service District)
 - career internships with the Clatsop Works program.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Knappa High School provides career training in the field of natural resources. Classes we provide include forestry, woods, construction, and welding. Through partnerships, our school can get students access to career training at Clatsop Community College (including historic preservation, fire science, and maritime training). Through partnerships with neighboring districts, students have access to classes in agriculture and fisheries. Students also have access to work based learning.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Volleyball, football, cross country, basketball (b/g), wrestling (b/g), softball, baseball, track & field. In 2022-23, all Knappa teams participated in state-level play. The 2022 cross country won the 2A state championship. We are a member of the 2A Northwest Athletic League. Our school provides an instrumental and choral music program, journalism, yearbook, and student-interest clubs like Dungeons and Dragons, Bible Study, GSA, and Key Club.

PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

We value parents and community as partners. Knappa High School is the hub of the community, hosting community meetings, sports, weddings, memorials, recreation, and worship. Athletic events are well attended by community members of all ages. Knappa High School is an emergency sheltering facility. Knappa Schools Foundation partners with our schools to provide classroom resources and scholarships. This spring, families will be invited to Knappa High School for student led conferences. Knappa School District works hard to maintain civility in all interactions with families, employees, and the community.
