ESSENTIAL DUTIES MAY INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:	<p>Responsible for specialized instruction and supporting students ages 0 through 26 years who are blind/visually impaired in schools within the Huron Intermediate School District.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide indirect or direct consultation services for students with visual impairments • Provide specialized instruction for students with visual impairments including but not limited to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Reading and writing skills using magnification equipment, large print material, and/or Braille ○ Assistive technology devices, equipment, and software designed for blind/visually impaired) ○ Plan, prepare and deliver lessons and adaptive instructional materials according to grade and level of students ○ Provide instructional support for students in academic subject areas ○ Provide instruction in daily living skills and community-based instruction • Coach others in evidence-supported interventions for students with VI; assist staff with implementing these and provide consultation • Support home and community (partner with families; serve as liaison between school and community agencies) • Support paraprofessionals with modeling • Conduct formal and informal assessments of student to assist in the determination of VI eligibility and PLAAFP as well as the impact vision loss in the school environment • Complete timely Multidisciplinary Evaluation Team (MET) and other written evaluation and progress reports for students with VI • Coordinate programs and services for students with special needs (e.g. schedule staffing and IEP meetings, behavior plans and/or disseminate paperwork) • Develop, facilitate, and/or participate in Individualized Education Program (IEP) team meetings for students with VI • Participate on various HISD Teams
