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TK and Kindergarten

Kindergarteners are learning the sounds ee and the silent e. They are also finishing up their animal research packets. When we start our presentations next week, students will share what they learned about their animals with the class. TK is learning about farm habitats. They also learned the letter sounds for Z, P, and Q.

Kindergarten just finished learning about 3D shapes. Your child should be able to tell you the difference between 2D and 3D shapes. Next week, they will learn to compare height, weight, and length. TK is learning how to solve simple story problems.

Our pumpkin seeds have grown so much in the past couple of weeks. Students have had fun tracking the growth of their very own plants in their journals. The plants will be coming

home on Friday. Soon they will have something else to watch grow. I haven't told anyone what it will be, so it will be a surprise.



Third and Fourth Grade Classroom Mrs. Mars

Last week students had the opportunity to learn something new with the 5th and 6th graders in a hands-on way. In science they dissected squid over the course of two lessons. These lessons were designed to allow students to explore the structures that exist

within both plants and animals that help them to survive in their environments.

Thank you for your generous contributions to our thematic auction basket "Fun In the Sun." We are collecting items related to summer outdoor activities. In ELA we are getting very close to finishing our "Rules to Live By" unit. Students have been working hard on writing an essay on their own "Rule to Live By" and will be completing their final drafts early next week.

Both grades have finished their chapters in math. 6th graders are getting a crash course in data and statistics while 5th grade will be reviewing important topics in preparation for the SBAC.

Speaking of SBAC- the test is scheduled for May 13 through May 24 this year. During these two weeks, please do all you can to get your student to school on time in the morning with plenty of rest. Testing can be tiring so we only test in the morning and keep our more fun classes intact in the afternoon.
