1. **Call to Order:** Pam Hilliard called the Regular Meeting to order at 6:27 p.m.
 - A. **Members Present:** Pam Hilliard, Kendra Holden, Daniel Moyer; Lisa Hunter via phone
Administrators Present: Supt Klaire Vogt; HS Principal, Aaron Dail; Theresa Priebe, Clerk
 - B. **Adopt Agenda:** By unanimous consent, the agenda was approved.
2. **Presentation:** Mrs. Bohman, Miss Loy and Miss Young presented on the Stem Scopes program that is used in grades K-12 for science, math, and reading.
3. **Public Comments:** None
4. **Approve Consent Agenda:** By unanimous consent, the Consent Agenda was approved. Coach; John Marone, THS Track Asst. Coach. Resignations from Suzette Acord effective June 15, 2026.
5. **Information Items:** Budget reports included: January 2026 ASB budget reports; Food Service report; Medical Insurance Pool and District Financial report. Enrollment is currently 329. Principal reports: **THS – Student Achievement** – FFA Winter CDE and LDE at U of I January 23rd; All-State Band performed on February 5th in Nampa, ID; Students of the Month of February category is School Spirit; **Communications** – Troy FFA Alumni auction is March 1st; Girls; Basketball in Lewiston and State basketball will be in Nampa, ID; Boys Basketball State is scheduled March 5-7 in Caldwell; Cheer State tournament scheduled for February 28th; JrHi basketball started February 9; Spring sports will start February 27th; Idaho High School Mock Trial regionals in Lewiston February 21st and State in Boise March 10-12; State Leadership BPA Conference will be in Boise March 2-4; THS Student Body hosted Winter Carnival January 30th; Parent Teacher Conferences will start March 10th; Prom is scheduled April 25th at Latah Fairgrounds; Safety Drill held on January 27th and Move Secure Defend Training held on January 29th; **Recruitment & Retention** –Formal Clinical Observations have begun. **Superintendent’s report: Student Achievement**— 4th Grade NAEP assessment; Spring IRI; **Financial/Transparency** – Hired an independent contractor to inspect the THS roof and reported that the roof is in good condition and there is flashing missing. **Facilities**— Fire Drill on January 27th and all-staff training on Move Secure Defend; **Communications**—Accreditation review included thirty-six standards, written narratives and evidence submitted; stakeholder interviews included leadership, staff, parents and student interviews. Some of the feedback received included high expectations, welcoming, family, connected, supported, students were respectful, advocates, students are prepared in school and beyond, inclusive, up to date facilities, opportunities to re-learn; Wants/Dislikes included parents wanting more sporting areas (gym); teachers scheduling barriers for electives vs core, food scarcity; students wanting to bring personal devices to school, have art class, improved school lunches, more SAT prep, and less stringent attendance; **Recruitment & Retention** – Mr. Dail with Project Leadership, K-12 Data Wall, Mrs. Stoner attending IMEA All-State music conference, Mr. Noppe attending IETA, and with the District Office position, Pam Hilliard volunteered to be part of the interview committee. Also mentioned was Board training offered for the 2026 ISBA Spring Leadership Institute scheduled for March 30th in Moscow; JrHi basketball coaching positions; Kelly Scholarship committee representative needed from Zone 1. Board Chair reported on the legislature happenings. Conformity is a big topic. Conformity is part of the One Big Beautiful Bill Act and Idaho is trying to match retroactive January 1, 2025. Governor Little has recommended conforming January 1, 2026, but Idaho wants to align Idaho with the Federal Government. At this time K-12 education is not impacted. Fund balances were discussed and school districts need to have a healthy fund in case of an emergency but it could be an issue. No CEC or raises for next year which could affect negotiations. Health insurance premiums are rising and we’re not sure if school districts will be fully funded for insurance so that may affect negotiations.

 - A. **Appoint Board Negotiators:** Daniel Moyer moved appoint Pam Hilliard and Lisa Hunter as representatives of the Troy School District for the upcoming negotiations with the Troy Education Association. Kendra Holden seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried.
 - B. **Appoint Kelly Scholarship Amount:** Lisa Hunter moved to approve the Kelly Scholarship award at five percent (5%) of the five-year average or \$7,007.82 to be awarded and distributed evenly among the applicants. Kendra Holden seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried. Daniel Moyer abstained from voting due to conflict of interest.
 - C. **Approve THS Head Football Coach:** Daniel Moyer moved to approve Kyle McCall as the THS head football coach for the 2026-2027 school year. Kendra Holden seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried.

- D. Approve THS Jr High Head Girls' Basketball Coach:** Kendra Holden moved to approve hiring Hannah Raymond as the THS Jr High girls' basketball coach for the 2025-2026 school year. Daniel Moyer seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried.
