Dear Parishioners,

As we begin this fifth week of Lent, we continue to prepare for the Sacred Triduum, now less than 2 weeks away. We will have the Chrism Mass, hosted at Holy Redeemer in Marshall on Thursday March 30, at 7 pm (typically, this is celebrated the morning of Holy Thursday, but may be moved to allow for wider participation). All are welcome. If you have never been present for one, it is one of the finest Diocesan liturgies of the year (rivaled only by an ordination).

It is the Mass in which the bishop blesses and consecrates the oils we use throughout the year before Baptism – Oil of Catechumens, for Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination of priests and bishops and Consecration of altars – the Sacred Chrism, and for the anointing of the Sick – Oil of the Infirm. It is during this liturgy that we priests reaffirm our priestly promises.

I encourage all to pay attention to the schedule for the Triduum Masses and services. I hope that we can have the church packed for all of them, but more importantly that we fall more deeply in love with Christ through the liturgy. These liturgies are the supreme model of all liturgy – a reminder of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Every Sunday is a little Easter – not that Easter is a more important Sunday as many might think. As we prepare for a greater focus on the Eucharist, these liturgies might inspire us and kindle a deeper Eucharistic amazement in all of us.

As I have written in the past, it was my encounter with the Lord during the Commemoration of the Lord's Passion as a 4year-old that captured me. I remember the liturgy and still feel its impact, but don't remember specific date, but it was April 8, 1977, as Easter was April 10. I don't recall anything 'special' about the service – Father Casey simply did what he was supposed to. There were no special songs, I don't remember the homily or anything specific. I recall that as Father held the cross for us to venerate, I knew the love of Jesus for me. It all clicked in my 4-year-old heart – that Jesus suffered on the cross and rose for me and wanted me to thank Him through my attendance. It was the exact thing my Mom encouraged me as she asked me to attend with her. An encounter with the love of God... every liturgy is to be that.

So, we first need to be there, and then we need to be open to the Spirit's promptings, that we recognize that our presence and worship is only returning to the Lord.

LITURGY MATTERS #20

Once the cleansing has been completed, in the incensing of the altar and the people, the priest then stands at the side of the altar and washes his hands, saying a verse from a psalm: "Lord, wash away my iniquity; cleanse me from my sins."

As the people see him washing his hands, they too should be reminded that the direction of the mass is about to shift. Our gifts have been brought forward and arranged on the altar. We have moved towards God, and now the priest, acting as Christ will move towards us.

Now Christ will make the hands of the priest his own hands, for there is only one priest, and the hands that will take up these gifts, transform them, and offer them to the Father, are the hands of Christ.

We have brought our lives in sacrifice to be joined to the sacrifice of Christ, and so the priest urges, "Pray that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father."

The people rise to their feet and respond with a short prayer that refers to the priest's hands, naming what is about to happen as "sacrifice at your hands." Our sacrifice is offered only through Christ.

The final prayer is called the Prayer over the Gifts. This prayer varies from Sunday to Sunday, but it always mentions in some form the gifts we have brought and prays for their transformation and ours. When we say Amen to this prayer, we are saying Amen to all that has happened from the collecting of the gifts to this moment. Now we stand poised and ready to participate in the biggest prayer of all.
