Course Information

Course Description: Proficient Band students at the high school level should have successfully completed the intermediate band proficiency standards and will receive honors credit. These students will exhibit a higher degree of performance, leadership, and musical response. They will be expected to understand and explain the contextual relevancy of different genres of music and other academic courses. Students will participate in all public performances; field trips and off-campus performances may be required by the instructor. Some Saturday rehearsals and competitions may be scheduled. Participation in these courses prepares students for further instrumental studies in music. Students may take this course multiple times.

Course Materials

Facilities and teaching methods: Students will experience instrumental music through various modes of learning including playing, singing, chanting, moving, reading, and lecture. Solo and small group assessments will be employed to help facilitate individualized learning. The use of Cleartouch Board, recording devices, will help students better understand and reflect upon their performances.

Canvas: Students are expected to check Canvas throughout the semester in the case of their absence. If they are absent it is their responsibility to see if assignments have been posted.

Required materials:

- Pencils, 1" Black Binder, Sheet Protectors.
- Instrument: Students who do not have their own instruments are encouraged to rent or buy an instrument. If you do not have an instrument of your own, there is a possibility of checking out a school instrument. We have a limited supply of school instruments, but will try to accommodate as many students as possible. Students who check out a school instrument are expected to keep it in working condition and are responsible for any repairs needed. See Mr. Dickens for more information on checking out an instrument.
- Woodwind students: If you play with a woodwind instrument, you are responsible for buying your own reeds. You should have at least 5 reeds in your case at all times, and they should be no lower than #2.5.
- Brass students: You should own your own bottle of valve oil or slide grease (Slide-O-Mix for Trombone players). You should also own a Straight Mute, Harmon Mute and Cup mute for your instrument (trombones should have a "plunger" also). It is also recommended that you purchase your own mouthpiece. The mouthpiece should be to the Trinity High School standards. Not all mouthpieces are equal. View our Band website page to find out which mouthpieces to purchase for your instrument. - Percussion students: Please have your OWN pair of drumsticks and mallets.

FEES:

Randolph County Schools assesses a **<u>\$5.00 band fee per semester</u>**. Students should turn this in to Mr. Dickens during the first week of each semester.

Provided materials: The teacher will provide music and other music literacy materials/lesson handouts. Students are expected to keep them neat and orderly in their black binders using sheet protectors. Binder checks will be performed for a grade periodically throughout the semester.

- All Students: Lead warm-ups in class by conducting.

Final Exam: Week of May 13, 2022. Students who have missed more than two days of class will be required to take this exam on the day pre-determined by our school administration.

CONCERT DRESS: When concerts are scheduled, Students are expected to wear concert black for all concerts.

- Men wear a black, long-sleeved, button-down shirt with black dress pants, black socks, and black dress shoes.
- Women wear a black top (short or long-sleeved) with black bottoms (long skirt or black pants), and black dress shoes. Please do not wear any clothing that is cut above the knees for the concert or low cut and immodest.

CELL PHONES: Cell phones will no longer be permitted once class starts unless Mr. Dickens invites you to use them for a playing test or an assessment. The research has shown how distracting they are to students while they are trying to learn. We will tune as a group each day, so no one needs a "tuning app" on their phone that they need to have out for class.
