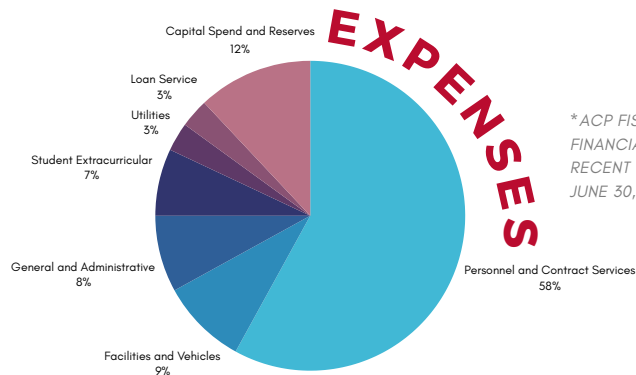
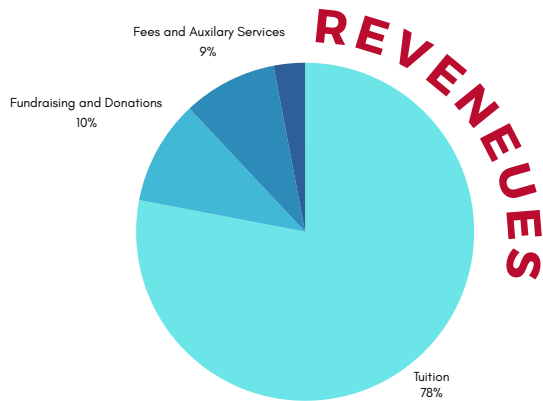

EXTRA CURRICULAR SNAPSHOT

ATHLETICS

Antonian has experienced a year marked by remarkable achievements! In various competitions, our community has excelled, with the cross-country girls and boys securing the state runner-up position. The varsity volleyball team clinched the district championship and made it to the state finals, while the football team progressed to the state semi-final. Cheer emerged as TAPPS state champions, our silver dancers secured a third-place finish at state, our swim team had a strong showing at the TAPPS state championships, and our tennis team appears ready for a strong challenge at the upcoming TAPPS championships. The Antonian basketball teams were state semi-finalist, placing 3rd overall, while our soccer teams advanced to the regional finals. Antonian spring sports (baseball, track, softball) have begun their seasons.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Our Student Activities department goes beyond events and gatherings for our students. Our clubs and organizations take pride in servicing to others through various collection drives throughout the year.

During our service drives, the generosity of our community shines through.

- Christmas Drive: 40 families/students participated, contributing 48 t-shirts, 20 sweatshirts, 35 beanies, 45 packages of socks, 34 board games, 15 care bags of necessities, 4 bags of toys and 55 blankets.
- Thanksgiving Food Drive: Created Thanksgiving food bags, providing meals for 38 families.
- Recent Blood Drive witnessed an impressive turnout with 52 students and 8 adults donating. This effort resulted in 54 whole blood donations and 6 double Red Cell donations, collectively saving 156 lives.

This remarkable engagement reflects the compassion and commitment of our community members.

ACADEMICS

Antonian is thrilled to share our recent achievements and advancements, reaffirming our commitment to excellence and innovation in education.

We are proud to announce our Accreditation Status from the Texas Council of Catholic Bishops Education Department (TCCB ED), highlighting our dedication to delivering quality education rooted in Catholic values.

Our school provides a comprehensive academic experience with a diverse range of honors, advanced placement, and dual credit classes. Our 9th - 11th graders participated in the PSAT in October, with two opportunities for the SAT Test and AP exams in May. This year, the introduction of PSAT/SAT/AP Blitz Days aims to enhance student preparedness and focus on essential strategies for improved performance.

Celebrating academic excellence, 31 scholars have been recognized by the College Board, with 25 designated scholars and 6 commended scholars based on outstanding PSAT scores. ACP has received the prestigious Gold Designation from the College Board for exemplary participation and performance in the AP program.



ACADEMICS CONT.

Looking ahead to the 2024-2025 school year, we are excited to announce a partnership with Blinn College for a Forensics Certification program available to our juniors and seniors. We are also expanding our AP Course offerings, including opportunities in AP Drawing, AP Spanish Literature, AP Pre-Calculus, AP Physics, and a Cybersecurity certification program.

Our commitment to excellence extends to our teaching approach, utilizing data for informed decision-making and implementing NWEA tests to monitor growth in English and Mathematics for 9th and 10th graders. Our dedicated faculty continues to develop vertically and horizontally aligned curricula by department/content.

In addition to academic support, we've partnered with Varsity Tutors to provide 24/7 tutoring for each core academic course, reinforcing our dedication to student success. Our school's technological prowess is evident through 1-1 devices for students, Google campus status, and the integration of CleverTouch boards in every academic classroom.

Our curriculum committee is comprised of students, teachers, administration, and parents, to ensure that we are evaluating our courses and expanding our course catalog to meet the interests of our students.

SCHOOL SAFETY

In our ongoing commitment to ensuring a secure and nurturing environment for all members of our campus community, significant measures have been implemented to enhance school safety. The purchasing and installation of surveillance cameras strategically placed throughout the campus serves as a proactive step towards maintaining a vigilant eye on our surroundings.

Additionally, to bolster our commitment to the well-being of our students and staff, a dedicated police officer is now present on campus, contributing to a visible and immediate response capability. These measures collectively reinforce our dedication to creating an atmosphere conducive to learning, fostering confidence, and promoting the overall safety of everyone within our school community.

Despite this, over 60 dedicated parent, student, and alumni volunteers came together to transform the gym. What was once a basketball game ending at 3:00 p.m. seamlessly turned into a dinner venue by 6:00 p.m., complete with carpets, decorations, tables, chairs, and a stage adorned with event prizes. The collective effort showcased the remarkable ability to adapt and create a memorable experience.

The 51st Antonian Wild Game Scholarship Dinner captured our \$ 24,000 scholarship funding, \$ 1,000 outstanding senior scholarship award and our 2025 capital campaign commitment. Please hold the date of Saturday Feb. 22, 2025 for next year's event.



CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Capital Campaign efforts are on the rise. Requested revisions to the Phase II (A) campaign project have been reviewed and some key components have been retained which include:

1. Renovation of the existing tennis courts – completed in 2023 and paid in full.
2. New girls locker room, showers, secure personal storage, expanded changing area, adequate number of separate electric outlets on different breakers to increase the number of individual hair drying components used at one time.
3. Adding the Swim team locker room to the current scope of work (Originally part of Phase II B).
4. Expanding the existing weight room with insulation for HVAC and adding approximately 960 square feet of usable space.
5. Renovation of the existing auxiliary gymnasium to insulate and add HVAC along with new flooring retaining one full size basketball court and two volleyball courts.

Conversations revolving around these projects continue with our community and stakeholders as we work to ensure the integrity of the original campaign.
