The Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR) will be administered to students in grades 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 between March 28-April 8. The tests are intended to measure students' progress in meeting the State's Common Core Learning Standards. IAR results may not be available until June. We also report our general academic progress to the community, as the overall results for IAR tests are summarized on our annual State School Report Card. The district is using the NWEA-MAP Assessment and Edgenuity Assessments to guide instruction.
