Chemics, today's Black History Month recognition goes out to Thurgood Marshall who was born in 1908 and later became a lawyer and civil rights activist. Marshall's victory as an attorney before the Supreme Court in Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka helped to establish his reputation as a formidable and creative legal opponent and an advocate of social change. Marshall argued that segregation in public education produced unequal schools for African Americans and whites. This case led to the declaration that racial segregation in public schools was unconstitutional. Marshall later became the first African American justice of the U.S. Supreme Court, serving the court from 1967 to 1991.
