This year's curriculum has sparked a new student enthusiasm for the learning program.

With avidity, our new administration undertook the organization and promotion of school pride. The students accepted responsibility for following their leadership in pride as the entire school prepared the self-study for the Southern Association evaluation team.

The **English** curriculum has now been divided into semester courses including English Literature, Oral Communications, and Mythology. Drama has proved an inspiring course as students presented performances for public entertainment.

In the area of **social studies**, sociology, American government, and philosophy increase social understanding. American history students choose the era in which they are most interested.

Sophomore Seminar is a new concept designed to incorporate orientation, Americanism vs. Communism, first aid, library skills, and drug information studies from a psychological as well as a factual view-point.

A fourth year Spanish course was added to the **foreign language** curriculum. Latin forum, attending "Man of La Mancha", and a journey to French Haiti stimulate interest in culture.

Intriguing, titillating, thought-provoking, mind expanding — that's **math**. With the addition of a pretty new math teacher, students struggled to master business math, algebra, trig., and general math.

In the **science** area, Mr. Black has introduced a stimulating independent biological studies program. Students research and report on environmental problems.

Industrial arts students have become involved in electronic principles, designing and constructing electrical devices.

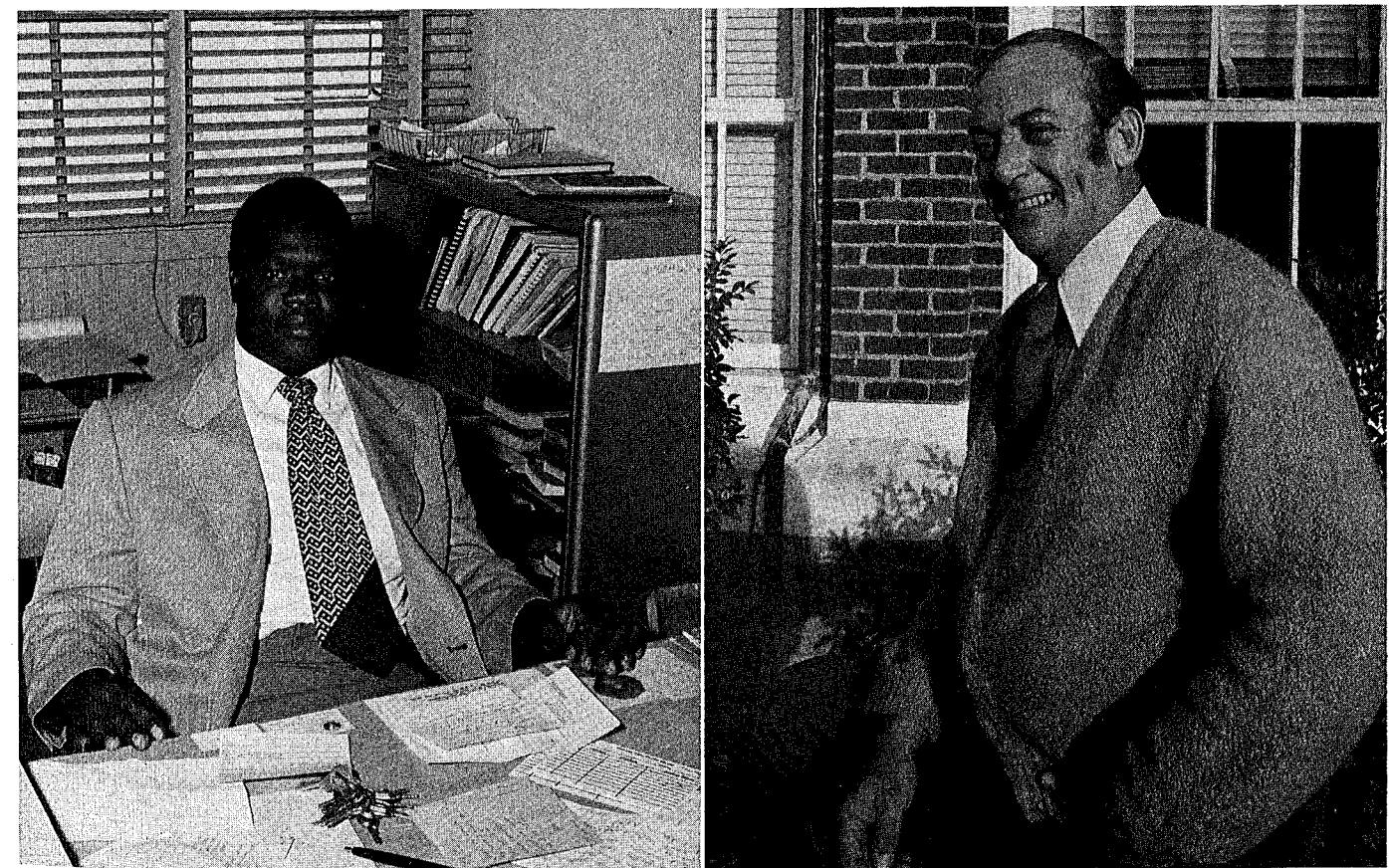
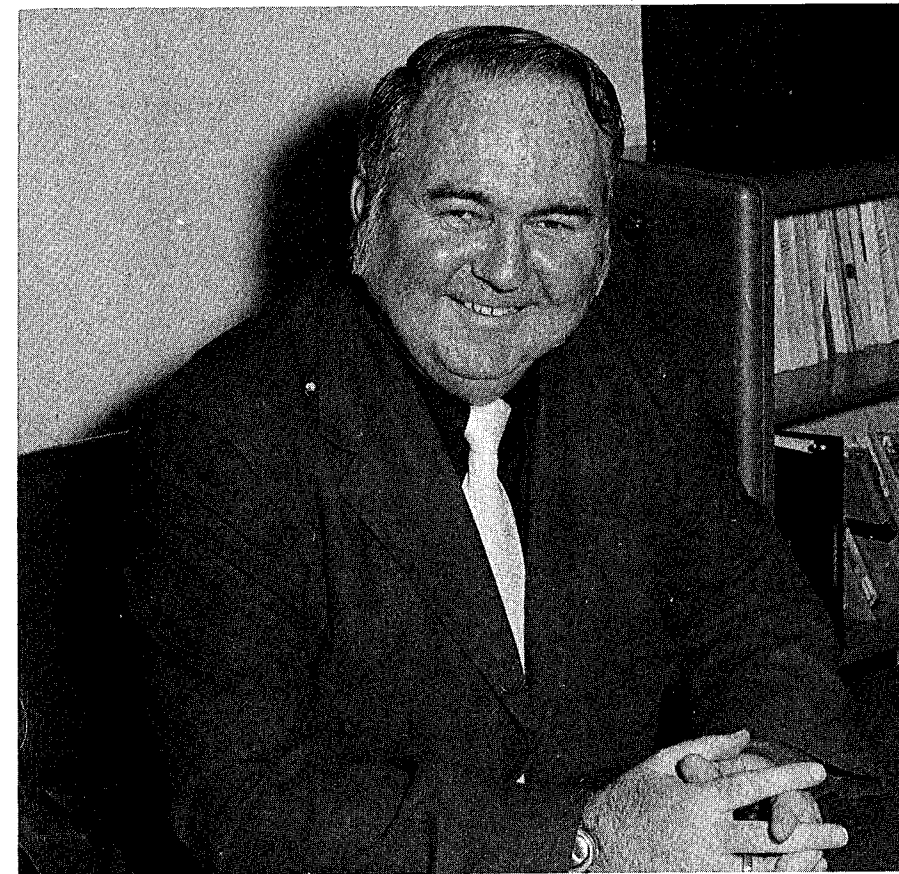
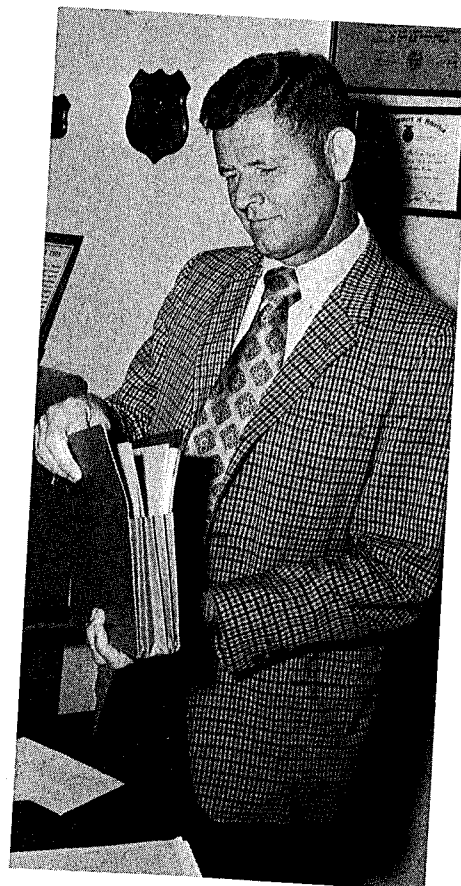
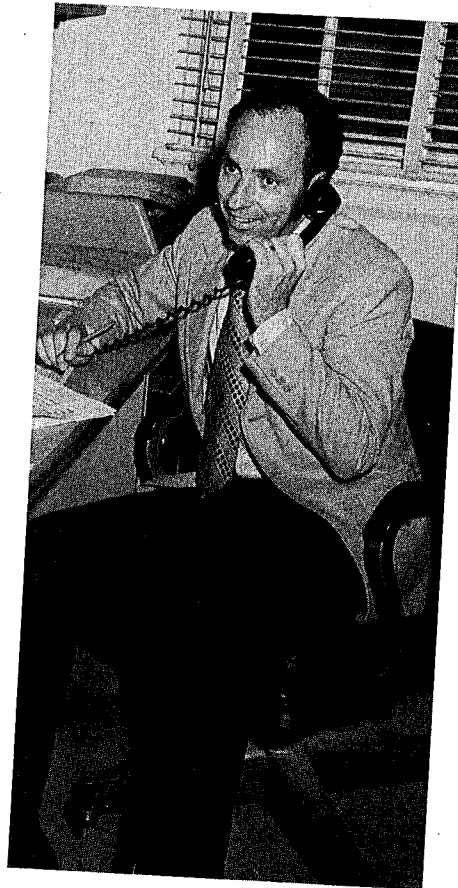

To keep our athletes trim, **physical ed.** has added a varsity sports class.

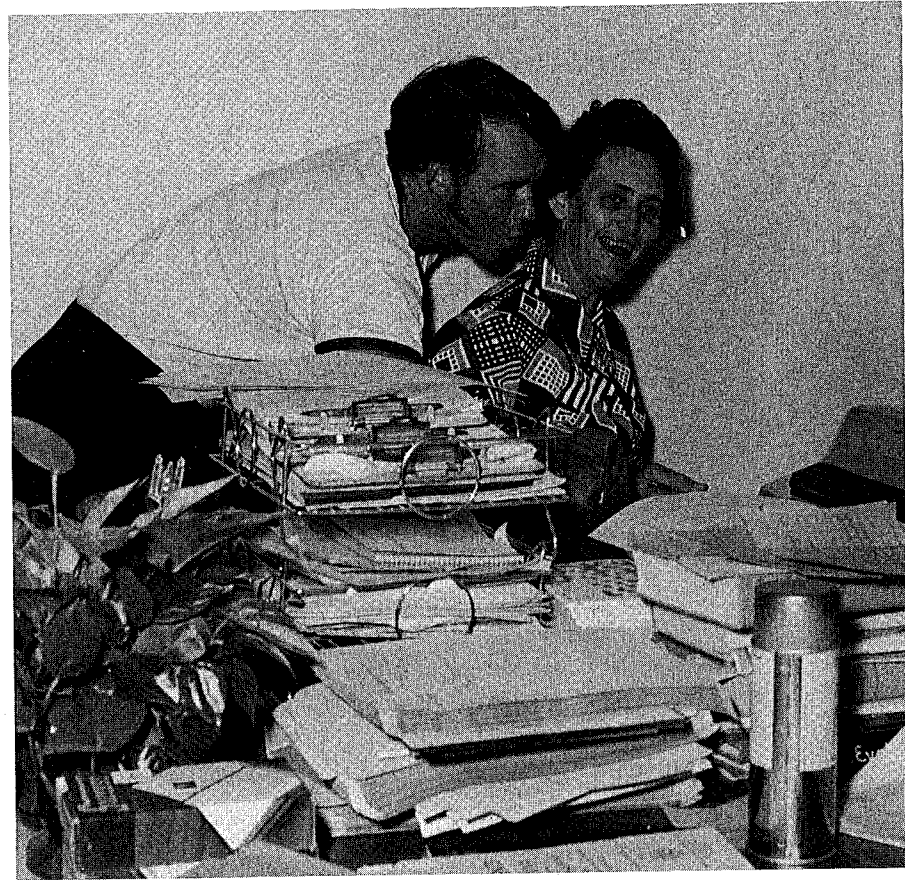
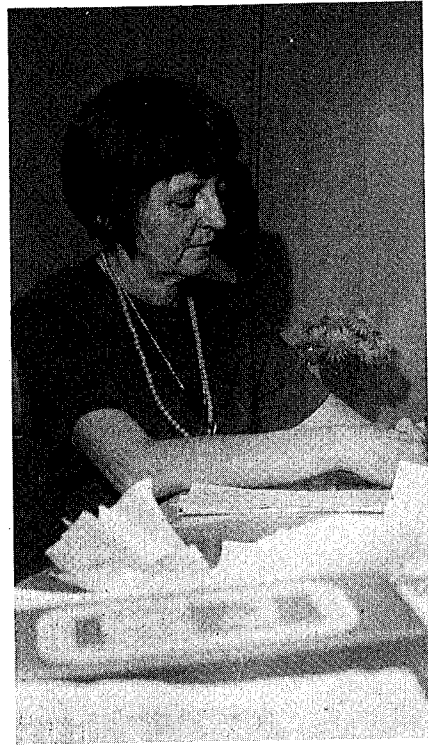
Phase III of **Polk Voc. Tech.** has enlarged the capacity and the variety of subjects offered for meeting the community's needs for vocational skills.

ROTC has opened the field to the female sex, while continuing to maintain high military standards.

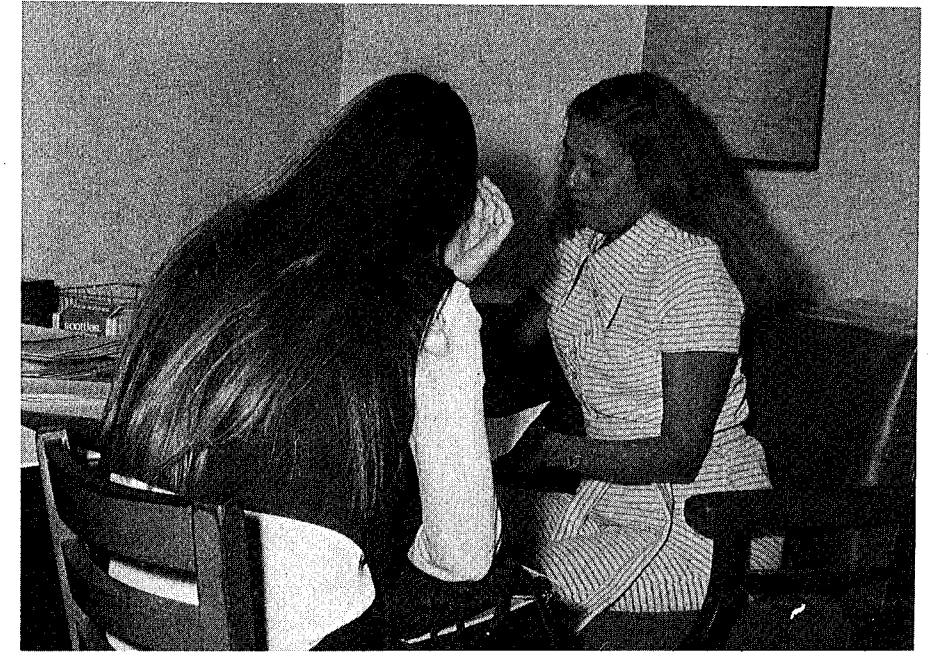

Continuing their outstanding achievements in their Senior year they won first place for their homecoming float. In November,

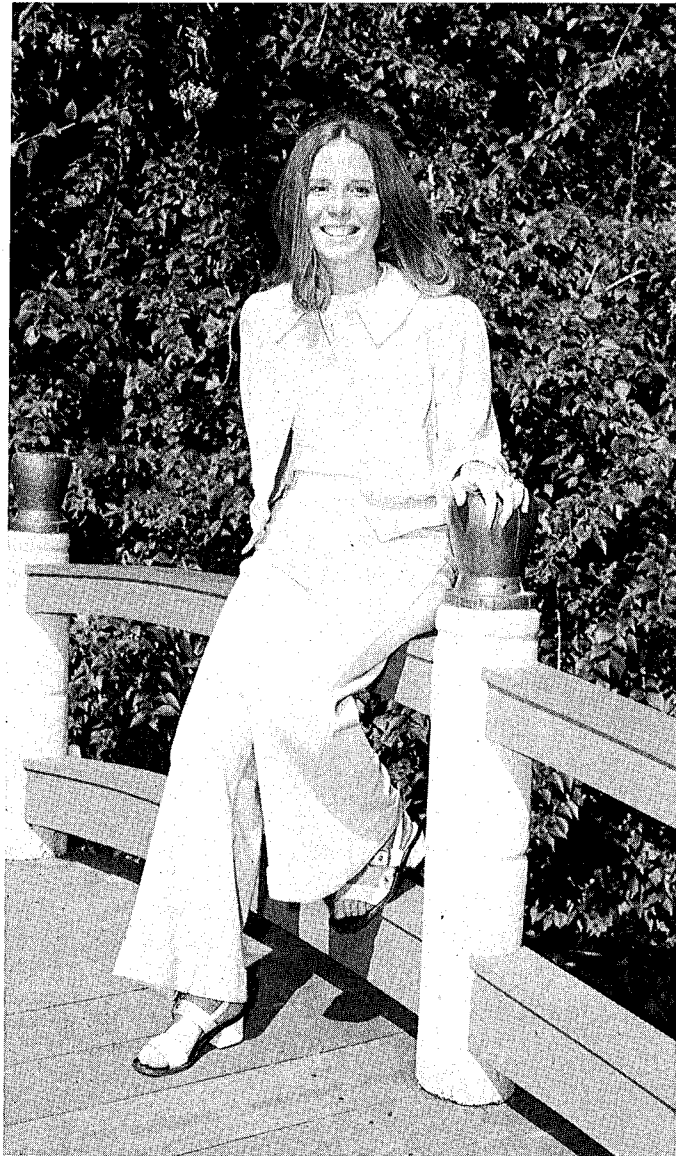

Many juniors showed their ability to work together as they pooled their efforts, working for hours in the Citrus World warehouse to produce a Homecoming float that won third place.

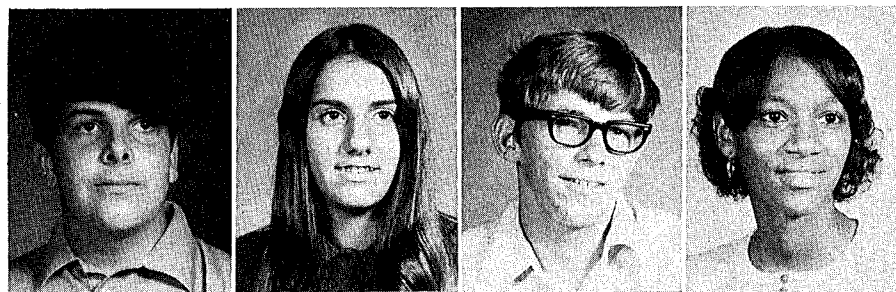

After contemplating many suggestions and all alternatives, the sophomores tackled their first money problem of the year by deciding a car wash was the most effective and appropriate

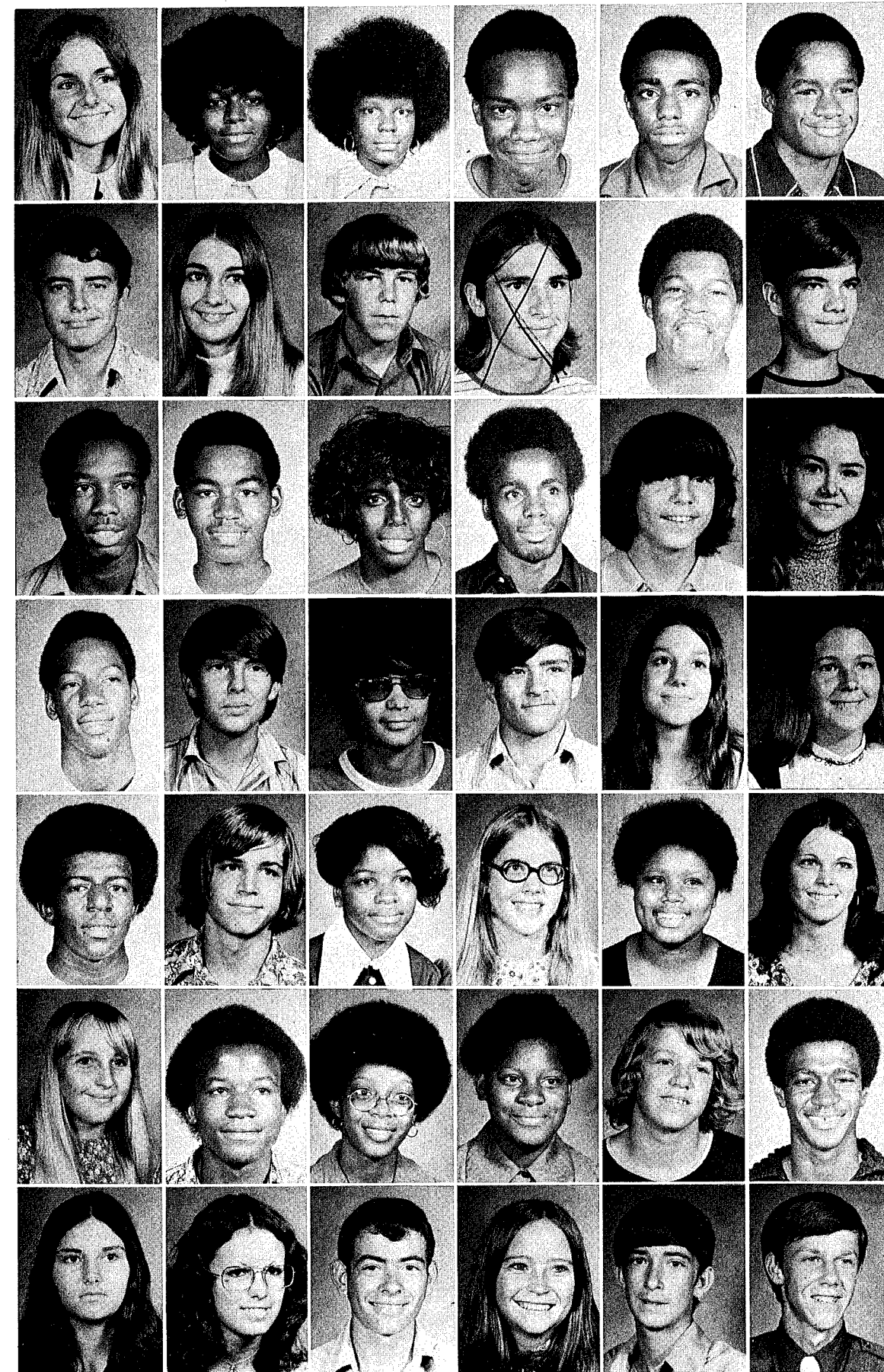
project. Thanks to the willing sophomore hands, the car wash was a success.

twenty-six clubs fill school life

With the many diversified clubs and organizations found at LWSHS, each person is able to find a group that best fits his need or interest. The four main types of clubs found here are Service, Honor, Vocation, and Interest clubs. All together, there were twenty-six clubs this year at LWSHS.

The service clubs sometimes joined together and sometimes worked independently in school and community projects. **Serviteens** won second prize for their outstanding float in the Homecoming Parade. To help spread Christmas cheer, they made decorations for the Convalescent Center, gave a party for the Crisis Center children, and decorated the West building. A chorus line of Serviteens entertained at the Lion's Club Minstrel and for the Women's Club in the spring.

Interact made the headlines when Emil Jahna won his third straight Tricycle Race. The club helped the Athletic Department by donating weights to the field house and by a money contribution. Interact also ushered at the Passion Play.

Beacon Club started the year by painting all the school trash cans. They decorated doors at Christmas, and in March they joined with Serviteens in a Rummage Sale to raise money for Operation Bookstrap. The girls also held their traditional "Shoe Shine Day." For Easter they had an Easter egg hunt for the Crisis Center children.

Key Club this year held a Turkey Shoot at Thanksgiving. This event raised enough money to fill many Christmas boxes along with the food raised in their Canned Food Drive. Key Club boys helped with the Downtown Development by digging ditches for future plants.

At the end of the year they entertained presidents, vice-presidents and sponsors of all clubs at a Leadership Banquet.

Those members in honor clubs are recognized either for their leadership or academic ability. Members of the **Student Council** managed the Homecoming activities and for a new event combined Silent Day with Hobo Day. Student Council placed a juke box in the cafeteria and sponsored the Tricycle Race. At the end of the year they enabled students to grade their teachers by writing up teacher evaluation sheets.

The **National Honor Society** entered a contestant (Joe Iskra) for the first time in a "Brain Brawl." Members also sold soft drinks after school to raise money for their induction ceremony.

The **Avantes Club** enabled students to show what they could do in their second annual Talent Show.

Vocational clubs and organizations are a vital part of the club program. In these programs, students learn skills and gain experience in their chosen fields. Members of the three **CECF** (Cooperative Education) groups go to school part-time and work part-time. Those in job entry work full-time to gain elective class credits for graduation. Students work in stores, offices, and plants, enjoying the independence that comes with a job. David Waller, with the aid of his Waller girls, became District Governor after a vigorous campaign. At the end of the year the three groups joined together in a large, formal Employer Appreciation Banquet.

Girls in **VOE** (Vocational Office Education) learn valuable training in secretarial work before obtaining jobs in offices. VOE girls helped teachers with clerical work this year.

Members of **FFA** worked hard in projects of livestock, agriculture, poultry, and forestry. This year, two members, Andy Harvard and Leland Hale, re-

ceived the State Farmer degree, the highest degree available to a member in the state of Florida. Together the two earned \$5,488 from labor and projects.

The **FHA** girls held their annual Twirp Dance at Christmas where Debbie Stembridge was crowned as the new queen. They attended the District meeting and Linda Harrell and Janice Wittman attended the State Convention.

Men and women interested in military careers found excellent training in the **R.O.T.C.** The Color Guard and the Highlander Guard, who led the way in several parades, performed at all home football games. In competition at a District meet, the R.O.T.C. men showed their excellence by placing first in four categories.

The interest clubs cover a wide range of concerns, each important and interesting to its members. In the music department, the **Highlander Band** performed half-time shows at all the home football games. They received straight superior at District and throughout the year gave several excellent concerts. The **Chorus** was busy this year with a Christmas opera and beautiful performances at the Methodist Church and at Bok Tower for the Easter Sunrise Service. Carole Walcutt and Lucy Robinson received superior ratings and Joyce Jones, excellent, at the State Choral Music Festival.

The three foreign language clubs joined together for an International Banquet again this year. Each student dressed according to the style of the country he was studying, and skits were performed by each club. The **Spanish Club** highlighted their year with a trip to Lakeland's Little Theatre to see the play, "Man of La Mancha." Members of the **French Club** made an exciting trip to Haiti during the Spring Holidays. The students had a great time while learning about the French influence there. **Latin Club** attended

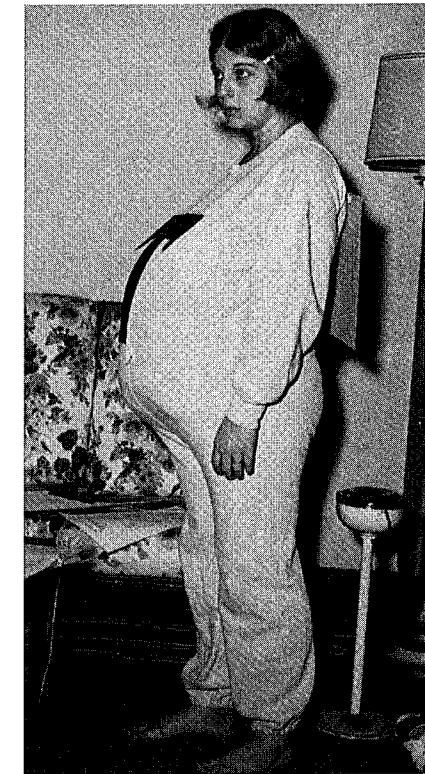
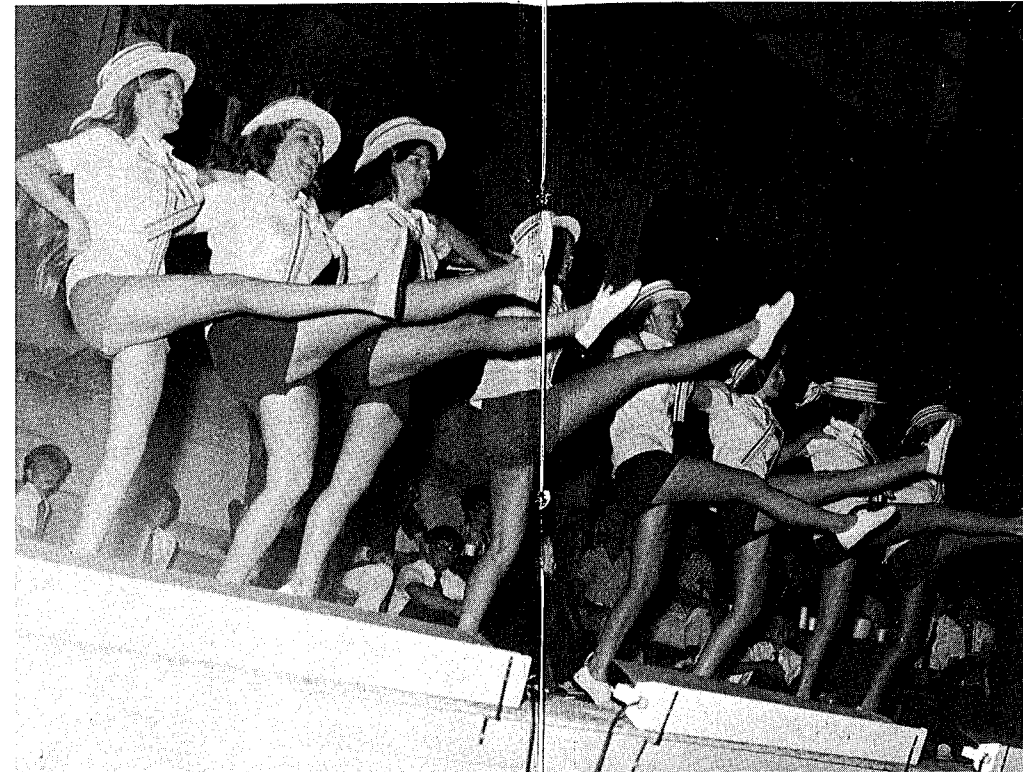
Library Council members combine interest with service. Besides learning library skills, these students decorate the room with posters and provide valuable service to students needing help.

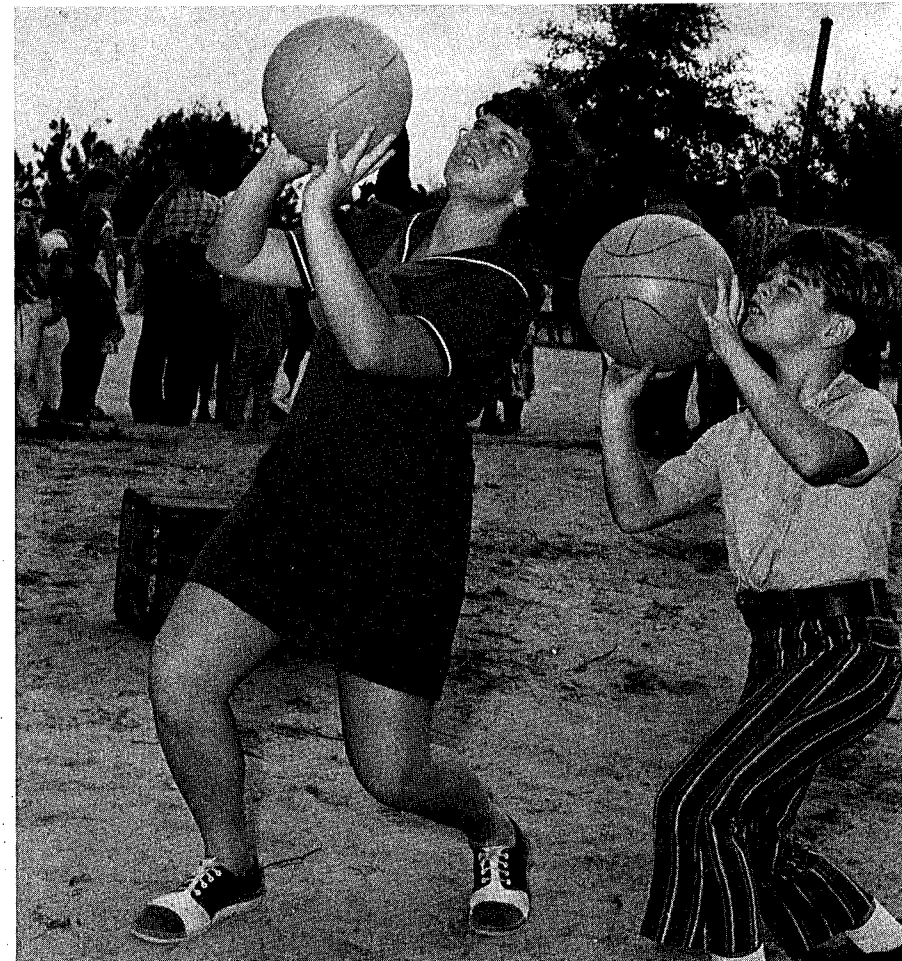
Those interested in the makeup of a newspaper joined the **Ridge Riter Club**. This group met as a class as well as a club, producing several fine newspapers during the year.

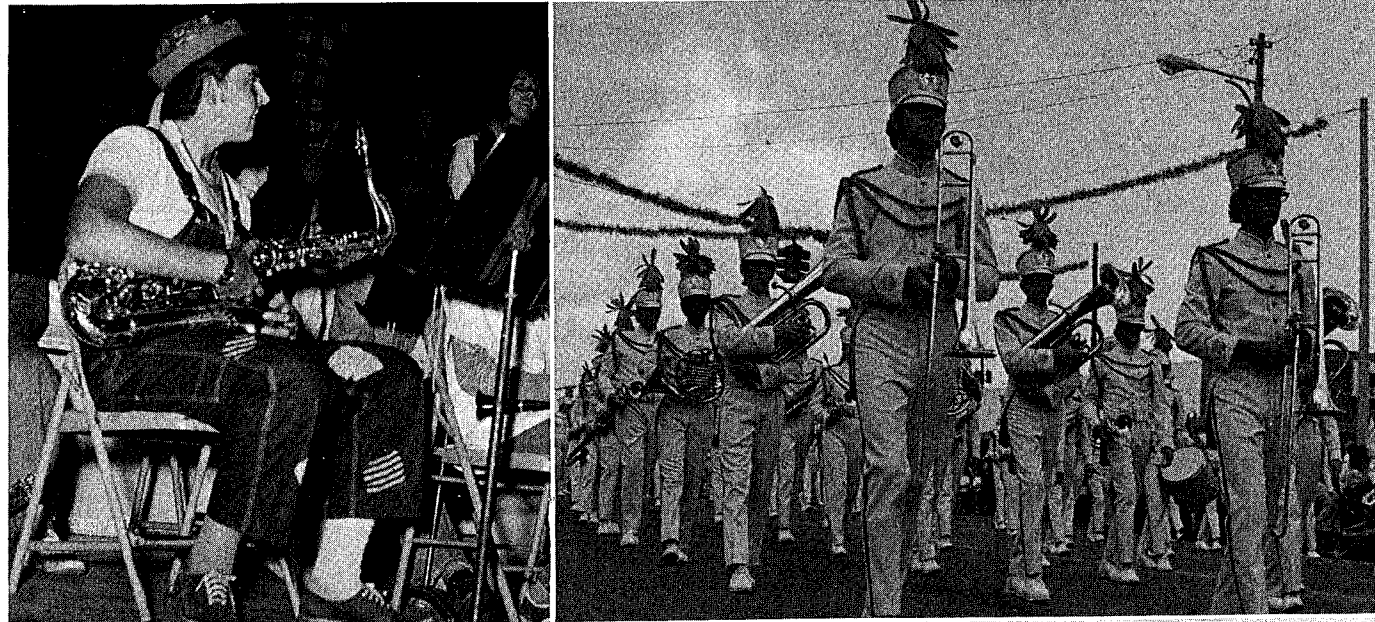
