- Administrative Report- Presented by Dr. Ray
 - Thank you everyone for being here.
 - Main focus point is the PYP/IB program. The PYP (Primary Years Programme) focuses on cultures, world perspectives, and how to become a better learner. This is an all inclusive program.
 - The program is very expensive, but we have been given \$10,000.00 by the community to complete our application.
 - The PYP direction will lead to the goal of increasing enrollment back to the previous school history.
 - There is a focus to increase parental support and to have more parents participate with the monthly parent meetings.
 - Our school grade was affected with Covid and we are hopeful to make positive changes as it was moving this direction prior to Covid by going from a D to five points from a B.
 - This will be the last year for FSA and hopeful that the state will make some changes with high stakes tests.
 - We continue to meet the needs of our children. We feed them, provide clothing and shoes. Janie Howard Wilson was recently given \$5,000.00 grant for shoes and socks.
 - Our mission statement has not changed since I have been the principal. The mission statement will need to change as we move forward with the PYP program.

 - o Awarded the Vulcan Grant for student incentives and field trips for 3rd and 4th grade
 - Awarded the Splash Grant for 4th and 5th grade to go to Bok Tower
 - Applied for the Suncoast Grant
- School Improvement Plan- Reviewed by Mrs. Griffiths
 - o Reviewed the data on the school improvement plan.
 - Reading took a slight drop, but math scores took a big drop from the last year.
 - Our goal is going focus on increasing our reading and math scores.
 - Some of the barriers we need to address is the need for training with the new reading materials, new standards, and the need for a more comprehensive and consistent math program.
 - Student attendance continues to be a barrier. This year we have a social worker and attendance letters, and home visits are now consistently happening each week.
