AND SO I SAY TO YOU, YOU ARE PETER, AND UPON THIS ROCK I WILL BUILD MY CHURCH, AND THE GATES OF HELL SHALL NOT PREVAIL AGAINST IT. Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Apostles Peter and Paul. These great saints are often seen in contrast to one another— St. Peter as the visible head of the Church, representing structure, rules, and order; and St. Paul as the fiery missionary, proclaiming the Gospel to the nations. But in truth, they are not opposed. St. Peter also proclaimed the Gospel, and St. Paul, for his part, established Church structures and ordained bishops, including laying hands on St. Timothy in ordination.

Far from being in conflict, Peter and Paul stand in harmony, united in their love for Christ and their tireless work for the Church. It is not only because they were both martyred in Rome around the same time that we honor them together, but also because they embody the "both/and" nature of our Catholic faith: both structure and Spirit, both hierarchy and mission, both order and evangelical zeal.

As I mentioned before, I've been working on a book—a project that began five years ago and that I recently picked up again in the margins of my days. On Monday, I completed the final draft. A few generous people are now reviewing it for both editorial clarity and theological content. I'm genuinely pleased with how it has come together, and I pray that as others read it, they will allow the Lord to bring forgiveness and healing into their lives.

While some themes were clear from the beginning—like mercy and justice, virtue and grace—I was surprised by how often the theme of coming home surfaced throughout the book. It's as if that thread wove itself in, guided by the Spirit.

I plan to self-publish, with an official release date of August 1. That may be ambitious, but I believe it's possible. The title will be: *True Mercy Has Teeth: A Catholic Journey to Healing and Forgiveness.* Please join me in praying that it may be a source of healing for many.

Attached to the bulletin this weekend is the *Question and Answer* document explaining our current financial situation. I know that with the response we have already received that we are addressing this well, and again, I apologize for my oversight failure in not budgeting appropriately. We do now have a well-balanced and realistic budget for both parishes.

Questions and Answers on the Current Financial position of the Church of St. Edward

1. What is happening?

We are experiencing an operating budget shortfall, meaning that we do not have enough money in our checking account to pay the bills that we already have or expect to receive before the end of the fiscal year of June 30, 2025.

2. Why are we short in our operating budget?

There are several factors, primary is that we failed to properly budget one particular item: Health Insurance. A few years ago, the Diocese moved all parishes to a group plan for lav employees – priests were already on a Diocesan Group Plan. There was an underestimation of the costs by the diocese and insurance company, and as a result, the insurance offered was more affordable than some other employers, which lead to spouses & families switching to the Diocesan Plan. The costs were raised (capped at 20%) for the last two years, and I failed to adjust adequately for the increase. In addition, in the past, we paid only 50% of the employees' cost, the rest was paid by the employees. The Diocesan plan set the percentages paid, and was increased to 75% paid by the parish, and 50% of the spouse/family was added to the parish portion. This made insurance jump from about \$20-40,000 three years ago to about \$120,000. That's an increase of almost \$80,000.

Other factors include the lower income since COVID, that we were using COVID funds that 'hid' the shortfall, and that the economy in general was down so giving may have been less and fuel and other prices were more.

Also, some of the fundraising efforts did not meet the budgeted goal.

Finally, though perhaps smaller, is that the process of running a capital campaign often leads to a temporary situation of less money going into the operating budget.

3. Do we need to offer insurance?

The simple answer is yes. We are required to offer insurance. The Diocese has now readjusted the amount for both the parish pays as well as the deductibles for more economical costs. We cannot remove employees from insurance with the promise of paying them a little more for finding their own insurance. While we did give a modest cost of living adjustment this year, many of those with insurance will be netting less in their take-home compensation.

4. How come the collections report in the bulletin are ahead if we are short?

The small report in the bulletin is the total of a few lines of the income budget, namely Sunday Collection, loose plate, and commodities. We did not budget these lines adequately to cover the expenses, and we should have budgeted another \$1,500 or so per week for the shortage. The proposed budget starting July 1, 2025, is both balanced and has a more accurate number for the collections needed.

 What have we been doing about this? We have had to 'borrow' from our savings and some from our income on the investments in the endowment fund. That is a band aid approach, but unfortunately necessary to meet our obligations. We still have money in savings, and the endowments are still well-funded, but we need to stop going into our savings. We propose that we budget a surplus to build up our savings and endowments.

6. What more can we do about this?

We are preparing a summarized report for your review for the year end. Watch for this report in late August.

We introduced a Stewardship Prayer to be prayed together during the weekend Masses after the Petitions, and in the fall, we will have a series of homilies on stewardship as a gift of self in terms of time, talent, treasure, and prayer.

We have a more realistic budget, and while a stretch in some areas, we should be able to keep on goal. The Sunday offering budget is raised about \$80,000, and some of the school fundraisers are also raised. Your continued generosity is deeply appreciated.

7. How else can you help?

We are grateful for the numerous commodities that we receive, as well as the gift of stocks. Both of these benefit the giver in avoiding paying taxes on the commodities or capital gains taxes, and so these are a great benefit to both giver and the parish.

Also remember the parish in your will or estate planning. Some have named their parish as an equal share of the estate along with their other dependents.

Please consider setting up an online giving. We use the Our Sunday Visitor's online giving site, but most banks also allow you to automate payments to a church. They print the check and mail it to the parish. This becomes a no-hassle way of giving.

8. How can we continue to do the renovations if we are short of money in the operating budget?

There is a clear distinction between the operating budget (the ongoing day-to-day costs of being a church – salaries and benefits, utilities and insurances, and supplies), and the Capital Campaign. This parish did extremely well with the Capital Campaign, raising about \$1.2 million in five years. That money is donor designated, restricted and in separate funds, and the various projects are then paid using those funds. The current renovation process (repairs, painting, pews and kneelers, flooring and refreshed liturgical furniture) are money set aside in that Campaign fund.

- 9. An invitation: As many parishioners were so generous with the Capital Campaign, can we re-focus on giving toward the operation of the facilities we have just renovated and beautified? If those who supported the campaign could give one half of what they did per year to the Campaign could give to the Sunday collection, we would be well set. I am aware that this may be a stretch for some, but others may be able to do more.
- 10. Thank you! Thank you for reading this Q & A and thank you for your generosity. I do believe that while we are in a difficult time, we can face it courageously with faith, and I have the hope that we will be in a much better financial position next year this time.
