
# **Haunted Trail**






#### Thanksgiving/Grandparents Day

Preparing motivated, responsible, productive, lifelong learners

At the October School Board meeting, the school board decided they wanted to gather some information from parents of our current students about the option of moving Calhoun R-VIII to a K-8 district and allowing our Calhoun High School students the opportunities they currently do not have because of our low enrollment numbers. From the responses we got back, over 85% of families are in favor of moving to a K-8 District and providing opportunities for our High School students. We currently only have 21 total students in grades 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>. It is very difficult to have enough students for extracurricular, co-curricular opportunities and for a variety of academic classes and programs. This has nothing to do with district finances, this is not a cost saving measure; Calhoun R-VIII school district has very strong balances in the bank, with over 50% reserves and can continue on as a K-12 school district without any financial concerns. This conversation is strictly about the lack of opportunities for High School students due to low enrollment.

We do not have a Business, Ag or FACS teacher to offer FBLA, FFA or FCCLA organizations that promote leadership opportunities because we do not have enough students to fill those elective courses. We are only able to offer these courses and many others online such as upper level Science, upper level Math, Computer Science, Business, Agriculture, Family and Consumer Science, Industrial Technology to name a few.

K-8 districts misconceptions or common questions:

- Will I have to provide transportation to the other schools for my High School students? The answer is NO.
  - Calhoun would be required to provide bus transportation to one area high school, such as to Clinton, Windsor or Leeton, but not all 3.
- Will this affect my taxes? The answer is NO.
  - You will continue to pay taxes to Calhoun R-VIII Schools, not the area school districts higher tax rates.
- Will funding be cut for Calhoun Schools if they go to K-8? The answer is NO.
  - We will continue to get the same funding because any student that finishes 8<sup>th</sup> grade is technically still a Calhoun student for funding purposes. Calhoun would pay tuition to the school district the student chooses to attend for High School, so we continue to get funding for those students from the state. Similar to how Leesville has paid Calhoun Schools for their students to attend High School in Calhoun over the years.

Some area K-8 Districts and their K-8 enrollments:

- Leesville-109
- Shawnee Mound-51
- Davis-48
- If Calhoun moved to K-8 we would be approximately 60 students in K-8

Years ago Calhoun graduated 15-20 students regularly and smaller classes would still be 10-15 students. The last three years we have graduated 6, 4 and 3 students and this year will graduate 3 students. With these small class sizes in high school, our students just don't have the same opportunities as other area High Schools.

We will have a community meeting for anyone interested in asking questions and discussing the possibility of transitioning to a K-8 and allow our High School students opportunities at area High Schools they don't currently have.

Meeting date will be December 7th at 6pm in the Calhoun Schools gymnasium for anyone interested in attending.
