Practice At Home

- ❖ **Read, read, read!** It is Read Across America Week!
- ❖ For math, practice adding and subtracting numbers using a variety of different strategies. These strategies might include decomposing numbers, using a number line, or drawing the base ten form of the numbers to add or subtract, etc.
- ❖ Challenge your kiddo to measure items around the house using a variety of measurement units. Then, discuss the difference in lengths and widths of those objects.

This Week's Agenda

Spelling: au, aw, augh

Au- comes in the middle of a word like in 'haul' and 'fault'

Augh - comes in the middle of a word, like in 'caught'

Aw- comes at the end of a word, like in 'thaw' and 'saw' AND can be followed by 'n' like in 'fawn' and 'yawn' AND ends a syllable like in 'aw/ful' and 'aw/kward'

Reading: We will be taking a break from pollinators this week to focus on our LOVE for reading! We'll be spending a lot of time reading independently, undergoing Dr. Seuss book studies, and learning about Dr. Seuss.

Math: We will be reviewing addition, subtraction, and measurement this week in the context of Dr. Seuss and his books!

Social Studies: We will continue to investigate what substances we should use to make a sticky and strong glue.
