
After the latest ILearn Checkpoint 1, Laurel Elementary scored the highest in the county and higher than the state average with our Math scores!

39% of our students scored proficient or advanced on mathematics.

4th and 5th grade exceeded state and corporation averages in mathematics.

21% of our students scored proficient or advanced on ELA.

6th grade exceeded corporation average in ELA.

Grade K - students can correctly ID numbers 1 - 10 88% of the time

Grade 1 - 75% of students can correctly write numbers 1 to 100

Grade 2 - 100% of students tested can solve addition and subtraction word problems with 83% or higher accuracy.

Grade 3 - 44% of students tested can add or subtract with regrouping with an accuracy of 75% or higher.

Grade 4 - 78% of students tested can solve multiplication and division word problems with an accuracy rate of 75% or higher

Grade 5 - 100% of students tested can solve mixed skill word problems with an accuracy rate of 75% or higher

Grade 6 - 100% of students tested can multiply fractions by fractions with an accuracy rate of 89% or higher

Airport Experience

On November 24th and 25th, students in grades Pk - 6 will be visiting an "airport". This experience will help to build the background knowledge that our students lack. According to reading research by Hart and Risley (2003), there is a "30 million word gap by the age of three between children in professional families and high socioeconomic status and children in families from lower socioeconomic status, such as those receiving welfare support." In order to level this deficit,

vocabulary enhancement is vital. Teachers are already working daily to close this gap, however, by creating fun, memorable experiences, words come alive for students. This airport adventure will be our first experience.
