What is AVID?

AVID's mission is to close the opportunity gap by preparing all students for college and career readiness and success in a global society.

At PVHS, AVID is a voluntary elective course that students take throughout their high school career. They stay with the same teacher and student cohort for all 4 years, building a family dynamic, allowing students to support each other through the challenges of preparing for college readiness. AVID students have a shared goal of earning acceptance and attending a 4-year university right after high school.

While the AVID Elective is not for every student, the AVID strategies are!





First-generation, low-income **AVID alumni** who go to college are **four times more likely** to graduate than their **national peers**.





PVHS AVID Data - A snapshot

PVHS AVID students represent around 10% of the school population. They have similar demographics and socio-economic status. However, they make up the majority of students in upper level courses junior and senior year.



Pioneer Valley's AVID Program Breakdown

11 Sections: 3 Freshmen % 2027, 2 Sophomore % 2026, 3 Junior % 2025, and 3 Senior % 2024

Students are on contract and are required to:

- Maintain a 3.0 overall weighted 10-12 academic GPA
- Take the most rigorous courses appropriate to the student (honors, AP, AHC Concurrent)
- Participate in at least 2 sports and/or clubs per year
- Earn 50 hours of community service per year

These requirements are designed to ensure that students build a strong academic and community resume. Many AVID students graduate in the top 10% of their class. We have had multiple AVID alumni serve as the class valedictorian or salutatorian.

AVID Skills Taught - WICOR and More!

Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, Reading, and More!

Accountability: Be on time and an active participant in classes

Self-Advocacy: Know how to ask for support when needed

Professionalism: Interview preparedness, email etiquette, resume building

Life Skills: Budgeting, college/career readiness skills, financial aid support

Collaborative Study Groups: Tutorials twice a week with senior tutors

Military Branches: Army, Navy, Air Force


We have even had a student take a gap year to be the CA State FFA President, then he was off to Cal Poly!
