1. Narrative description of the Proposition 28 arts education programs funded (2500 character limit).

The Prop 28 AMS funding supported bringing local artists and musicians into grades K-6 for art and music numerous times during the 2025-26 school year. Watershed art, work with acrylic on canvas, painting on pumpkins, textiles, tempura, oil and pastels projects, 3D art, art from recycled materials, a Rap song performed by a 3rd grade Native student during a local native Big Time event, Native cultural items such as drums, medicine bags and dream catchers made by all students K-6, and other fun art projects were completed in 25-26. Next year ERCS plans to bring many of the same local artists to work with students throughout the year.
