Peanut Recipe - 1st Place, Olivia Grant, FMMS; and 2nd Place, Olivia Swendeman, MCMS. These competitors developed their own peanut recipe. Each tweaked the recipes several times before reaching perfection. Students were judged on safety sanitation practices, presentation, taste, and use of peanuts in the recipes. Their hard work and dedication paid off by placing first and second in this state competition.

Chapter Booth Display and Design - 2nd Place, Shelby Manley, Arav Patel, Dana McIntyre, and Madilyn Taylor, FMMS. These FCCLA members designed the booth, collected/purchased items, sought advice and guidance from HCHS SkillsUSA Officers. At the end of September, these students worked together as a team to put up the booth display, adding several informative details which brought their vision to reality. Collaboration was used to make sure all aspects of the rubric were met with the maximum number of points possible. These FCCLA members are already working on the design for next year.

Georgia Organics Pepper Palooza - 1st Place, MCMS FCCLA Chapter, and 2nd Place, FMMS FCCLA Chapter. Starting in August, both school's FCCLA members and FACS students participated in a plethora of activities with peppers as the focus. A variety of peppers were grown, many recipes were made with peppers, research projects and oral presentations on peppers were shared. Dr. Mark Scott, Superintendent of Houston County School District and members of the Houston County School Board joined in on the fun, as pictured below. Everyone had a 'pep-pepperytime'.

Each student presented their speech in front of a live audience at the Georgia National Fair. After many hours of writing speeches and practicing several times in front of peers at school and family members, Morgan and Drisana were very pleased with their results.

Brochure Design - 1st Place, Chandlar Curry and Ayla Wood, MCMS, category Male Recruitment; and 4th Place, Charlie Freeman, FMMS, category Foundation Sponsor Recruitment. These FCCLA members certainly exhibited their due diligence in researching information about recruitment, respectively in each category. After gathering data, collecting photos, and creating a digital

design, students put all these components together to produce an award-winning brochure.

Chili Cook-Off Competition - 2nd Place, Madison Johnson, MCMS. Madison spent several weeks creating her own recipe for this competition. She was judged on safety, sanitation, attire and final product taste. The judges observed this competition as the product was being prepared on site at the Georgia National Fair.

With the above winnings from each school, Mossy Creek Middle School earned the Georgia National Fair FCCLA 2023 Superior Chapter Champion alongside Feagin Mill Middle School earning Superior Chapter Reserve Champion.

American Council on Germany Visits TMS FFA



Last year in November, TMS Agriculture Teacher, Ken Ford, was recommended by the former Commissioner of Agriculture, Gary Black, to be a part of The American Council on Germany (ACG). The American Council on Germany selected Mr. Ford to participate in the ACG Leadership Mission on Agriculture Policy and Resource Scarcity. Mr. Ford served on the ACG as a representative for Georgia Agricultural Educators and Minority Farmers. The

experience served as a valuable professional opportunity and contributed to strengthening transatlantic relations. The program gave the cohort of nine American professionals from Georgia insights into the challenges and concerns of agriculture, farming, and food-supply conditions, as well as trade agreements and policy making. This year the nine farmers and agricultural professionals from Georgia hosted nine farmers and agricultural professionals from Germany.

Thomson Middle School FFA hosted the farmers and agricultural professionals from Germany on October 28, 2023. The group was greeted with a parade by the TMS FFA Chapter, parents and guardians, and administrators. TMS FFA Officers began the tour with the FFA Opening Ceremony in the TMS cafeteria and gifted the German friends with many TMS, FFA, and agricultural gifts. When introductions were given, the group got a chance to tour the agricultural facilities at TMS. They began in the Agricultural classroom/lab where Mr. Ford explained about American Agriculture Education in today's

classrooms and FFA. The remainder of the tour was led by TMS FFA Officers, FFA Members, and the Pig Show Team. The group got the chance to tour the greenhouse, school/community garden, chicken layers, livestock barn, and they ended the day by all getting a chance to walk the show pigs.
