WIN Time News

WIN (What I Need) News:

After a two-week cycle of targeted math instruction:

- Grade K - **84% of students** can identify numbers 1 to 10
- Grade 1 - **82% of students** could randomly identify numbers 1 to 120 and score 75% or higher.
- Grade 2 - 42% of students could add or subtract fluently to 100 and score 75% or higher.
- Grade 3 - **80% of students** could identify the place value of 3 and 4-digit numbers and score 75% or higher.
- Grade 4 - **83% of students** could add or subtract 3 and 4-digit numbers with regrouping and score 75% or higher.
- Grade 5 - **50% of students** could solve multi-digit multiplication problems and score 75% or higher.

Grade 6 - **60% of students** could correctly reduce fractions and score 75% or higher.
