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RETURN OF RGSD CONVOCATION

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\$2000 SIGNING BONUS TO JOIN RGSD

Riverview Gardens School District continues to seek qualified candidates to fill certified and non-certified positions in the district. The SAB recently approved a \$2000 signing bonus for new RGSD employees through Oct. 1, 2022. Also, current employees who refer successful candidates for higher will receiver a \$1000 referral fee, if the candidate is hired and remains in good standing for the 2022-2023 school year.

The Special Administrative Board also recently approved the following salary increases for staff members for the new school year:



- \$15/hour minimum salary for support staff (revised Custodial, Food Service and Clerical Salary Schedule)
- One step movement for teachers (exception longevity teachers will receive 3%) and all support staff (exceptions: Custodial, Food Service, and Clerical)
- 3% increase for administrators

Still, the district is seeking to fill more than 150 vacant certified and non-certified teaching, administrative and support staff positions. Thursday, Aug. 25, the District will host a hiring and career fair from 4:00 – 7:00 p.m. at the administrative building, located at 1370 Northumberland Drive.

Summer brought to a close what was possibly the most trying year for educators and families across the country. Yet it was a rewarding school year as well. We all felt the residual effects of COVID and the transition to full inperson teaching and learning. After almost two years of virtual/hybrid instruction, we were able to recognize and address the emotional strain on our scholars, faculty and staff through training in Restorative Justice Practices. We made it through multiple transitions at the Board and district leadership level.



We heard you when you said that a disconnect existed between Central Office and the buildings. We've worked hard to re-engage RGSD staff, alumni, partners and the community, at all levels of decisionmaking. We have made great progress in moving forward and making a more welcoming environment through our new mantra: A New View on the Horizon. Most importantly, we have started to chip away at the achievement gap and make strides to improve student academic performance.

While we still have a ways to go, we are committed to move towards true educational equity and excellence. Our Special Administrative Board has shown commitment and leadership to ensure all students get the best we have to offer each and every day. Our Board is also committed to letting our faculty and staff know that you are appreciated, as evidenced by not one but two pay increases across all classifications for the 2022-23 school year.



Now begins the work to develop and implement the Turnaround/Priority Schools process. This process is designed to improve student performance districtwide in ELA and Math, with our partners from Solution Tree. We will work aggressively to change the narrative about RGSD, making us a destination district for scholars and staff. We will roll up our sleeves to address the needs of our facilities and grounds in partnership with our feeder communities. Additionally, we will continue our journey to learn, train and implement restorative justice practices.

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As we move forward, the inclusion of student voice will give a conduit for student input across all levels of decision-making (curriculum, hiring, policies and procedures), giving students input in their educational future. One example of this commitment is the establishment of the Student Leaders Advisory.

Teacher, parent and stakeholder voice will help on our journey to regaining full accreditation. It will add in the accountability of the Turnaround/Priority work as well as the development and monitoring of the District's Comprehensive School Improvement Plan (CSIP).

The 2022-2023 school year will usher in a full court press of changing the narrative and becoming the New View on the Horizon, cultivating a sense of community and family connection throughout our scholars' RGSD experience.

I want to again welcome everyone to what I believe is going to be an amazing school year for Riverview Gardens scholars, families, faculty and staff. Please join us in our journey of transformation.
