We can't wait to show you what we've been working on!

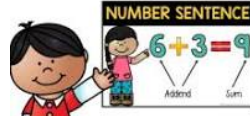
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TK and Kindergarten

Kindergarten students learned the letters w, j, r, and y. They are learning to put a finger space in between words when they write and draw a picture that matches the phrase.

Kindergarten is working on adding two numbers. Students are using manipulatives to help identify two numbers equal to the whole number. They are learning to read number sentences and find the missing number in an addition sentence. Next week we will move on to subtraction.



TK students are learning about animals and their habitats. They are learning about the different characteristics of animals and what they need to survive. TK is learning the letters in their names and practicing how to write their names. They are also working on counting syllables in words.

TK students are learning about the numbers 6 through 9.

Exciting news... it has been confirmed that we will be rearing another batch of salmon! We will receive our new eggs mid-January!

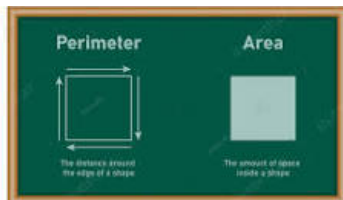
